Knox – A Scent Free Zone?

When we all use scent free products (often labeled 'Free & Clear') we allow our church to be a more comfortable place for those who are extremely sensitive to the layers of scented products that many of us use. When we say 'more comfortable' it means the sensitive folks don't have to leave the building because of massive headaches, coughing, sneezing or other allergic problems We will also be living in a more green way.

Remember scent free is the same as **Fragrance** free. Check the ingredients of the products you buy. If fragrance is listed then it is not scent free.

- There are unscented deodorants that do a good job. Did you know as our bodies heat up a scented deodorant gets *more* scented. Imagine when 150 or so of us in the church together sending off that much fragrance.
- please ladies, let us stop using perfumes all together.
- gents ditch the aftershave and colognes
- Fabric softener is not necessary. Use some vinegar instead.

Knox – A Scent Free Zone?

There are many products that offer unscented, fragrance free alternatives. You can probably find them wherever you shop.

Here are some suggestions.

Shampoos/conditioners; Prairie Naturals, Arctic Sun, Curelle, Honest shampoo. A few drops of Pure Argon Oil massaged into hair after washing can replace conditioners

Face & hand cream & lotions; Curelle, Honest face and body lotions, Dove hypoallergenic bar soap, Eucerin, Body Shop's Aloe Vera day & night cream, Oil of Olay, Aveeno

Sunscreen skin products; Equate SPF 60, Green Beaver.

Deodorant; Lafes deodorant stick - wet before applying, NutriBiotic, Secret, Dove, Nivea

Clothes washing detergent/dish soaps; Kirkland 'Free & Clear' Laundry Soap (liquid), Seventh Generation (Free and Clear) which also includes household cleaners, diapers and training pants.
