Discussion Questions

1. What are some of the big ‘if’ questions that you are experiencing or have experienced in your life? (Examples: If I get into that program, if we have kids, if I get the job, if we get married) Do these kinds of uncertainties excite or intimidate you? Why?
2. Read Romans 8:31-32. What reason(s) does Paul give us from believing that God is for us? What do you think are some of the implications of the reality that God is for us and not against us? As a group list as many as you can and talk about how these things impact your daily lives.
3. Are there times that you are tempted to think that God is against you? What leads you to think that way? How does this chapter help you to understand what God really thinks of you?
4. If God is for us, what is God against? Is God for some people and against other people? How do you know one way or the other?

Moving Forward

Are there things in your life that you need God is against? These are difficult things to admit and deal with, but it is freeing to overcome them. Spend some time in smaller groups talking about things that need to be removed from your life. Pray for one another and remind each other that God is for you.
