Rabbi Harold Kushner once wrote a story about forgiveness. It's illustrates how unfair forgiveness can be. I first read the story in *Feasting on the Word*. Here's what Rabbi Kushner wrote.

"A woman in my congregation comes to see me. She is a single mother, divorced, working to support herself and her three young

children. She says to me, 'Since my husband walked out on us, every month is a struggle to pay our bills. I have to tell my kids we have no money to go to the movies, while he's living it up with his new wife in another state. How can you tell me to forgive him?"

"I answer her, 'I'm not asking you to forgive him because what we he did was acceptable. It wasn't; it was mean and selfish. I'm asking you to forgive because he doesn't deserve the power to live in your head and turn you into a bitter, angry woman. I'd like to see him out of your life emotionally as completely as he is out of it physically, but you keep holding on to him. You're

not hurting him by holding on to that resentment, but you're hurting yourself."

Here's my thoughts: An offense can leave deep wounds and unsightly scars. But there comes a point when the offender has moved on, and withholding forgiveness hurts you way more than the offender. Forgiveness seems unfair, and yet it proves better in the end. Let's practice forgiveness as Jesus taught.



Courses being offered:

Intro to Lay Ministry Basic Course

This course is for persons discerning a call to proclaim the presence and power of God through serving in their local churches.

Intended participants: Anybody who is serving in any capacity in their local church or wants a better understanding of United Methodism or as a pre-requisite course for certification as a Lay Servant, Lay Speaker or Lay Minister.

Advanced CLS/CLM Courses:

NEW Storytelling

Participants in the course will learn what constitutes a good story, discover storytelling styles, learn the techniques of effective storytelling, and practice creating stories from their experiences.

Intended audience: This course is open to any Certified Lay Servant or Certified Lay Minister who is working on recertification.

Rediscovering Your Spiritual Gifts

This course will explore the special gifts of theology, witness, and organization that The United Methodist Church brings to the church universal, how we got where we are today, and how our distinctive emphases are still needed in the 21st-century church.

Intended audience: Any Certified Lay Minister or Certified Lay Servant.

NEW Lay Pastoral Caregiving

This course offers insights into the life span and the dynamics of contemporary life to help church leaders reach out with God's love and care to others.

Intended audience: This course is open to any Certified Lay Servant or Certified Lay Minister who is working on recertification.

This course focuses on the ministry of the lay servant who either regularly or occasionally leads a group or congregation in worship.

Intended audience: This course is open to any Certified Lay Servant or Certified Lay Minister who is working on recertification.

To keep your certificate current as a Lay Servant or Lay Speaker, an advanced course is needed every three years; Every two years for a Certified Lay Minister.

How will our Virtual Academy work? We will be scheduling all courses between the two week period from October 12th – October 23rd with four two-hour class sessions and two hours of work off-line.
