Article paraphrased from "A New Kind of Leader" by Reggie Joiner

ids matter more than adults. Yes, I said it. If you're an adult, you may be offended, but before you burn this article, let me clarify exactly what I mean. I'm NOT devaluing any person at any stage of life. An adult's life is just as valuable as a kid's life. No, the world doesn't revolve around your kid. What I am saying is that the first 18 years of a person's life are CRUCIAL for laying a firm foundation for their future. If that's true, doesn't it make sense to start influencing their character and faith as soon as possible?

What if we started acting like what we do for kids is more important than anything else we do — as parents?

And as a church? What does that mean? How does that affect the way we operate today? How does that change the trajectory of our church?

Sometimes changing a diaper, filling water balloons, remembering their pet's name, or writing an encouraging text before their big test can leave an impression, and early impressions matter! A child's brain is made up of actual experiences. Basically speaking, what you do for a kid is an investment, increasing value over time. The sooner you start investing, the greater the return later. The early years shape so much of one's sense of purpose, belonging, and identity.

Let me rephrase our original statement: What St. Lukes does for kids is more important than anything else our church does. Think about how Jesus challenged His culture to shift the way they thought about children. "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me."

So what if kids don't sound like God, act like God, or smell like God. You should welcome every kid as if you're welcoming God. And if you're comfortable with who is showing up on Sundays, then you haven't opened the door wide enough.

Kids need a new kind of leader who will volunteer to do something more. What someone did for you. What you wish someone did for you. What you hope someone will do for your kid or grandkid.

There are so many ways we as a church can move forward to raise up our families. I challenge you, whether you have kids or not, to do any or all of the following:

- If you're not volunteering, start. Don't wait to be asked. Take the initiative now.
- Pick a family to love. Pray for them. Babysit their kids. Invite mom or dad to coffee. Send them encouraging cards in the mail. Find ways to intentionally build your relationship with kids and parents.





Sanctuary with worship during the Modern service. Please check your children in at the check-in station in the Narthex prior to entering the sanctuary. At 9:45, the children leave to travel with Odyssey. They will meet in the "customs room" to get their lanyards, have their passports stamped, and get into groups (they might enjoy a little sing-a-long time as well). Then they are off to their journey where they'll watch and play along with the story of the day in drama. They do a craft in the market place to reinforce the story, and then visit the synagogue to learn lessons to take home.
