Greetings from the Ngorika Family,

Once again we find ourselves at the end of another year reflecting on God's faithfulness and provision. When I reflect back on the 15 years that I have been involved with Ngorika, I marvel at the journey that God has taken the Ngorika family. It has been a blessing to be a part of what God has done through the Work of David and Pinenah and through the generosity of faithful donors.

Reflecting on Ngorika's Impact

Nearly 20 years ago Ngorika obtained a plot to build the home, and took in our first boys in 2006. Now at the end of 2019, with the completion of secondary school and KCA exams for Stephen, Benjamin, and Gregory, we are celebrating 9 boys and Amy (David and Peninah's daughter) who have completed their

secondary education and are pursuing a post secondary education. The youngest boy, Francis, will begin his last year of secondary school in January. The vision of Ngorika has been to raise these orphaned boys in a Godly home and to provide for their education through secondary school. Through God's faithfulness and your generosity we will see this vision accomplished next year when Francis completes his exams. In addition to seeing these boys through their secondary education we have also been able to provide scholarships for their post secondary education, with Abraham and Ayub on track to complete their bachelor's degree in accounting and information technology in 2021. Anthony, Mahlon, Peter and Michael have all been accepted into vocational programs that include automotive, electrical, and animal health programs. Amy is at the same university as Ayub pursuing a degree in business and information technology.

Growing Independence

While living at Ngorika, the boys have grown physically, emotionally, and spiritually, gaining much needed life skills to become independent, contributing members of the community. Over the past few years, the board (in consultation with David and Peninah) has felt strongly convicted to stand by these boys and see them through to full independence to the best of our ability with the Lord's help and the extended NCH Family. To that end, the board has decided to do what we can for these children that David and Peninah have raised, and not to take in any more children. We will be phasing out the regular monthly support of the operation of the home, gradually moving funds from the operating expenses to the scholarship fund providing for the boy's education. We have plans to close out the funding from "west" of Ngorika as a children's home at the end of 2022.

We project that if our support level remains where it is now, moving funds from the operation of the home into the scholarship could provide a post secondary education for all the children. If you would like to sponsor a specific student we can allocate funds to that students scholarship fund, otherwise funds will go into the general scholarship fund to be used as needed for any of the boys. This is something that we could not have imagined just a few years ago. We are so grateful for all God has done and continues to do through your generosity.
