Thoughts from the Rector

For it is God who gave me unerring knowledge of what exists, to know the structure of the world and the activity of the elements; the beginning and end and middle of times, the alternations of the solstices and the changes of the seasons, the cycles of the year and the constellations of the stars, (Wisdom of Solomon 7:17-19)

As summer begins I am reminded of summers past – long past...my past. Each of us has our own experiences that have brought us to the place we find ourselves today. Each of us is the product of those experiences and the relationships that intertwine our days, our lives. Each of us brings to the gathered community of neighborhood, friendships, family, church, a distinct perspective and presence. Together we become yet another creation, ever changing as loved ones are born and live, move in and out of our lives, and depart this life for the eternal presence in God while always remaining with us, in us, mysteriously, inexplicably, throughout the seasons of our lives.

The mystery of creation resides within us all. We are all a part of the whole. We are peculiar creatures, to be sure. Made in the image of a loving God, we know something about love. Made in the image of a just God, we know something about justice. Made in the image of a relational God, we know something about relationship. Made in the image of a compassionate God, we know something about compassion.

As summer begins I find myself thinking of summers past. How I was young and carefree, allowed to frolic in the wind and waves, run and play, sleep soundly and awaken ready for new adventures, always secure in the knowledge of loved ones ready to care for me. I had idyllic summers when I was a kid.

Really, storybook kind of summers. I was lucky, blessed. And that awareness continues for me, always bubbling up when I am down, always hugging me with a new freshness as the days become longer or shorter, warmer or colder.

The seasons are a gift from our inscrutable God. They are a part of us, no matter how they manifest themselves in our lives. We human beings are connected to creation in all its glory in ways we cannot fathom. Seasonal change is a time that we find ourselves contemplating our pasts and our futures. It's something we have in common, something we share.

I pray that you find your summer days filled with old dreams and new hopes. May God bless you in your work and in your play, in your nights and in your days, in your comings and in your goings, this season and all the seasons of your life.





STANDING NOTICES

Weddings

Weddings at Gloria Dei (Old Swedes') Church must be scheduled with the clergy at least three months in advance. All weddings in the church will be governed by the Canons of the Diocese of Pennsylvania and the Book of Common Prayer. Pre-marital counseling is a prerequisite. No weddings will be conducted during Lent.

Funerals

When death occurs a family member is asked to contact the clergy so that timely arrangements for a funeral may be made. It is appropriate for the funeral of a Christian to take place in the church. It is also appropriate that funeral arrangements be made in advance and kept in a file in the church office. Burial plots are available for members of the parish in the church's cemetery. Consult the church office for costs and details.

Baptisms

The sacrament of Holy Baptism is celebrated during one of the principle Sunday liturgies and is governed by the Canons of the church and the Book of Common Prayer. Baptism is normally celebrated on one of the four appropriate feast days designated in the Book of Common Prayer. These are: The Baptism of Our Lord (1/13/13); The Great Vigil of Easter (3/31/13); Pentecost (5/19/13); and All Saints Sunday (11/3/13). Other Sundays may be chosen, if necessary, with the advise of the clergy. Baptism instruction will be provided for parents and godparents beforehand.
