

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Stir up your power, and come! The psalmist's plea in Psalm 80:2 has become familiar to us in the Advent prayers. Isaiah wants God to rip the heavens open. Both cry out for an apparently distant, angry God to show up, to save, to restore. When we hear Jesus describing the coming of the Son of Man with stars falling from heaven, it can sound dire and horrible, not like anything we would ever hope for. But when we really look at the suffering of people God loves, we can share the hope that God would tear open the heavens and come.

Virtual Holy Communion - did we ever imagine?

When we returned to 'in person' worship in September, we just did what we've always done. We gathered to celebrate the holy meal together, physically distanced, with masks, sanitizing, one element only, and not even the real bread, but together. And honestly, I had no 'past experience' to draw from regarding virtual, home communion.

In the olden days, pre-pandemic, we understood the importance of the sacrament of Holy Eucharist. The elements, the bread and wine, are consecrated (made holy), we come to the table to receive the body and blood of Christ. When folks were unable to join in, our communion ministers and I would take to our sick and those home bound.

During this pandemic, less movement, home bubbles and Amber stage prevent me from doing in home visits. So I've invited folks watching from home to bring their own bread and wine as they watched our taped services. After the Eucharistic Prayer I would say, to those at home ... take and eat, the body of Christ, broken in love for you. It didn't occur to me to have a theological reflection about virtual Eucharist. Until I was asked!

I was invited into this reflection work when someone said they didn't feel comfortable with just putting out their own bread and wine for me to bless virtually. So I did up a container of communion bread, already consecrated, for them to have at home. And when they reported they hadn't had communion since March and what a gift this was - I was sad and elated!!

The sadness that it's taken me this long to figure this out and of course, celebrating because we figured out an easy solution. Each of us comes to the Lord's Table with an understanding of this ritual and how it has its greatest impact on our souls. Whether we commune in person, via on-line, or by ourselves in one holy moment, the Holy Spirit is with us.

We are not alone. We worship a God who is omnipotent, omnipresent, and omnipotent ... we are covered by God's grace.

Please let me know if you'd like a home communion kit, we can make that happen!
