A Grinchy Christmas

One of the most iconic Christmas movies of all times is Dr. Seuss' *The Grinch Who Stole Christmas*. In case you are one of the 0.00001% of people who hasn't watched that movie the premise is this: A big, mean Grinch seeks to disrupt Christmas for a community by taking away all their familiar things and traditions. It sounds a lot like life in 2020 doesn't it?

Easter and Holy Week were different this year. Graduation, summer, fall, school, work, sports, vacations, family, life, all of it is way different this year. And not in a good way. There are lots of different proverbs, images and metaphors we could use—making lemonade out of lemons, making the best of it, pivoting. But in the end, 2020 has just been hard on all of us, particularly if you are older and isolating. And it seems particularly hard at Christmas.

But amidst the real heartache, there is good news. Do you remember how the movie ends? The Grinch seeks to cancel Christmas, but can't because even the Grinch does not have that kind of power. The same is true for us this year. Christmas will not be cancelled. Christmas cannot be cancelled. It may be different and feel kind of strange. but Christmas still comes because God still comes. At Christmas we celebrate how God has entered into our world through the birth of Jesus. The churchy word for that is 'incarnation.' Christmas means that the God we once knew only up in the heavens or far away from ourselves is now as close to us as the baby Jesus. Not even a pandemic can stop God and God's plan to save the world.

So in the meantime, what do we do? We do the same things we always do at Advent and Christmas, only with a twist. We make cookies and deliver them to those we love. We sing songs, decorate and put up trees. We remember to be thankful and let that thankfulness move us to concrete acts of generosity like supporting the many mission programs of the church and community. We worship and pray, even if we have to do it online or through a radio broadcast. Jesus is still coming. Not even a pandemic can stop that. Thank God for that.

Copies of the book are available in the church office for \$11.00 each. Please contact the church office for a Zoom link.


2021 Financial Pledge

From the Investment Committee

The Investment Committee meets quarterly to ensure that investment guidelines and policies are being followed and to ensure proper management of the Church's investment portfolio by financial firms that we have chosen as custodians. The Church investments are diversified over several asset classes and rebalancing is performed on a quarterly basis to maintain the target diversification ratios. An annual portfolio performance report will be forwarded to the Church Council for inclusion in the Church's annual report.

As of 9/30/2020, the church investments are showing an overall gain of 2% for 2020 year to date. For comparison purposes over the same time period, the Dow Jones Industrial Average posted a 3.7% loss while the NASDQ Composite showed a 3% gain."

Charitable Giving

The CARES Act, designed to help the nation recover from the pandemic, has five important implications for charitable giving.

- New Charitable Deduction for Non-Itemizers: Taxpayers who take the standard deduction can nevertheless claim a charitable deduction of up to \$300 for cash donations in 2020.
- **Higher Deduction Limits:** Individuals will be able to deduct cash gifts in 2020 to the extent of their entire adjusted gross income rather than a cap at 60%.
- Increased Deduction Limits for Corporations: The contribution limit for corporations has been raised to 25% for cash contributions this year.
- Required Minimum Distributions Waived: For the year 2020, there will be no mandatory distributions from retirement accounts, thus allowing those accounts to recover. Once they do recover, retirement funds are a tax-wise giving strategy.
- Waiver of Penalties When Retirement Funds Are Used for Coronavirus Purposes: If you are under the age of 59½, and withdraw money from your retirement plan to cover expenses incurred by you or a family member related to treatment of the coronavirus, the 10% tax penalty will not apply. In the future you may consider a retirement fund gift.

Please consult your tax advisor to see if you qualify!

Special Gifts

We are all familiar with giving to the General Fund which financially powers our ministries here at church. We are also familiar with giving to the Building Fund which pays the current mortgage for our 2012 church building addition. But did you know the church also receives special financial gifts for special projects?

A few years ago one of the 'saints' of this church named Lucille Kitzerow, left a modest gift to be used to expand and empower our music ministry. This gift continues to fund things like musical instrument purchases, choir robes, new music and Music at First Church concerts including our recent Halloween Concert.

Special gifts are also received in honor or memory of someone. Recently the Gustafson family, seeking to honor Bob Gustafson's long tradition of advocacy for teens and children, gave a memorial gift to the Youth Fund. Such a gift enables confirmation trips, mission trips and a host of other activities designed to help our young people 'flex' their faith muscles.

Lastly, special gifts can be designed for long term use through the Endowment Fund. Gifts given to the Endowment Fund are used to make sure the church has the long term financial resources to continue to do ministry in the coming generations. You can remember the church by including it in your will & estate planning. Thank you for remembering the church with your financial gifts & considering ways you may make the extra step of giving that will continue to empower the ministry of this church for years to come.

Ways to Reach Out to Others

All of us want to do something to help and be Jesus' loving disciples in the present moment. Below are some specific things you can do at home:

Quilts/Prayer Shawls: We continue to collect prayer shawls, quilts and handmade items. If you have some to donate, please contact Pastor Chris who will distribute them to our seniors and shut-ins.

Shut-ins/Seniors: We have connected our seniors/shut-ins with church families who send them notes, small parcels and kid's artwork. If you want to be matched with a shut-in, contact the church office.

Compassion Fund: There are families in our church who have been furloughed, fired, and laid off. We will be able to offer some modest assistance to these families through our church Compassion Fund. Gifts should be mailed to the church and marked 'Compassion Fund.' Families who need assistance, please contact Pastor Chris.

Twin Cities Recovery Fund: A fund has been established to help rebuild the Twin Cities affected by recent riots. The goal is to help in two ways, one with immediate help to families and second is to help small businesses rebuild. Money will be dispersed quickly through trusted, partner agencies established by the church.

Prayer: Prayer connects us with God and our neighbors. Pray for the helpers. Pray for your families. Pray for people losing their jobs. Pray for students learning online. Pray for families learning new routines. Pray for people cooped up inside. Each week there is a prayer list of people, situations and thanksgivings that is sent out by email to help people in their prayer life. You can sign up by contacting the church office. There is also a link to the prayer list on the church website.
