

Letter from Pr. Allan Johnson

This year a Christmas hymn has been running through my mind – "In the Bleak Midwinter." Even Christmas decorations on the street seem dreary. I miss the crowds, the Table, a hundred voices raised in joyful song. This year seems bleak and lonely.

So I give thanks, in this strange time, for the leadership of our pastoral team and Council. One measure of responsible leadership is what you do when we're suddenly facing a problem we didn't expect and we have no experience to guide us. I am grateful that in this time Messiah's leadership have centered on love for our neighbors: as our Catechism tells us, "We are to fear and love God, so that we neither endanger nor harm the lives of our neighbors, but instead help and support them in all of life's needs." I miss being in church; and if it were only about me and my safety, perhaps I could make up an argument why even in this pandemic I should go. But it's not all about me. It would not be faithful to put my neighbor's health at risk. So when in time our country has come through this danger, I will return to church with joy. Meanwhile, I am deeply grateful that Messiah's leadership has worked out ways we've never used before to bring worship home to me, and all my neighbors. I am deeply grateful that even in this time of isolation we have found ways to continue our ministry in this community, helping and supporting neighbors in all of life's needs. Leadership is when you face an unknown future and respond. With compassion. With creativity. And with a steady hand.

But it is still a bleak midwinter. So I remember Bethlehem, and a lonely stable outside town, where there was a definite shortage of colored lights and tinsel. A homeless couple, far from family and out of work. Soon enough they would be refugees. That is where our faith begins; where you and I are invited to trust a God who is with us not only when the songs ring out but in the bleak midwinters of this burdened world.

I admit this isn't the sort of God we might have wanted. Nothing here about prosperity. Nothing here about angels protecting us from harm. Only a God who is present with us in weakness, present in compassion, and in the end a God whose love not even death can turn aside. Not an easy God; but one worth trusting even when all the world is lonely and strange around us.

And in a surprising way, that bleak midwinter birth bears witness to me that we have put our trust in a God who is real. If I had been asked to imagine what God might be like, I don't suppose I ever would have started with Bethlehem, and Herod, and the Cross. The God who has come to us in Jesus is more clear-eyed, more real, and more surprising than anything I could have imagined.

So I give thanks; and in the quiet at home, I'll sing the songs. To a God who's real. To a God who can be trusted, whatever midwinters close around us. Until the morning breaks, and all the doors swing wide, and we are home in church again. And then, together, we will praise the God who comes to us in Jesus, and celebrate around Christ's Table, and raise our voices loud in joy.

Messiah Quilts & Kits for Lutheran World Relief

Our usual fall ingathering of quilt, baby care kits and personal care kits for Lutheran World Relief looked a lot different this year. In previous years, churches from the central and western UP brought their quilts and kits to a site in Ishpeming where they were loaded on a boxcar or a semi truck and transported to a warehouse in St. Paul. Because of the pandemic, we came to the difficult decision to cancel this event and wait until next year when we could do it safely. Thankfully Fortune Lake Lutheran Camp offered its facility as a drop-off site November 16-25 for all LWR items.

On Monday November 23, Phil and Nancy Hoover, Jeff Dodge and Jamie Dodge loaded a UHaul with Messiah's quilts and kits and drove to Fortune Lake. We are so thankful for these volunteers and for the staff at Fortune Lake who stepped up to meet this challenge. And we are thankful for our quilters and circle members who continued their ministry even during a pandemic to meet the needs of people all over the world. We thank God for you all! Shipped on behalf of Messiah will be 276 quilts, 47 baby care kits, 6 personal care kits, 0 school kits (items donated for school kits will be assembled & distributed in 2021).

Some of the items shipped to LWR in 2019 were in the port in Beirut at the time of the explosion on August 4. Fortunately these items survived the damage. More information on this can be found on page 13 of the Messenger in the article "Rising from the Ashes."

Qi Gong for Health & Wellness

Tuesdays, 12:00 - 1:00 pm

This Zoom class, sponsored in collaboration with Messiah Lutheran Church, is based on a series of gentle exercises developed by Buddhist monks. These exercises involve varying degrees of range of motion that can be done in a chair or standing.

Our class moves body structure for balance, stress and pain relief that are applied to daily activities: walking, turning, lifting, reaching, sitting. These gentle movements can also be used with prayer disciplines and use breathing as an essential component.

After greetings, each person in our class turns off their Zoom video on the computer and mute. The members enjoy the anonymity with permission to pause, go slower, to learn without being self-conscious or competitive. Since I can't see you, my concerns are for safety. I give ongoing verbal, detailed instructions for each movement. Each exercise includes individuals finding their range of motion, improving body structure, balance & breathing instructions.

There is, of course, no fee or charge for these classes but we invite you to make a contribution to Messiah Lutheran Church food bank at any time as a sign of thanksgiving.

Rising from the Ashes - An Update from Lutheran World Relief on Quilts & Kits Caught in the Beirut Explosion

The news and evolving reports out of Beirut following the deadly explosion of August 4 has had many of our heads whirling in the last couple months. As many of you know, three containers of quilts and kits were in the port awaiting customs clearance on the day of the blast. Immediate reports from the port authority indicated that the containers could not have survived.

A fourth container had been separated at the port in the United States and was still on the water at the time of the explosion. It was rerouted to the port in Tripoli.

As we joined with many of you in our shared lament, we were deeply inspired and humbled by your determination to keep going, keep creating, keep serving, keep sharing your love with our neighbors all over the world.

On the morning of August 26, we received an urgent update from our partner, Anera: they had been given access to the port, and against all odds, the containers were intact! Following this incredible news, LWR staff held our breath until the quilts and kits could be assessed for damage.

Finally, we learned on September 22 that, despite the magnitude of the blast, the seal of the containers containing the LWR Mission Quilts and Kits was not broken. The placement in the port, inside a concrete storage building and surrounded by other shipping containers, protected the containers enough to even prevent chemical contamination.

As we awaited this last piece of information, the fourth container cleared customs in Tripoli and travelled over land to join the other three in Anera's Beirut warehouse, once again bringing the full shipment together.

We give thanks to God that the love of hundreds of Lutheran congregations contained in this shipment will be able to be shared with more than 24,000, of our neighbors in Beirut and across the country of Lebanon—many refugees from across the region, and now also those affected by the blast in the heart of Beirut. From the ashes of this crisis rises a beautiful ray of hope: your love, intact and powerful, in just the right place, at just the right time.

As your gifts are distributed in Lebanon, LWR is also providing emergency food, helping families to repair and return to their homes, distributing appliances and cooking supplies to help them restore normal life, and more—all thanks to your love and generosity. January Book Study: "Stations of the Heart" by Richard Lischer

This poignant love story of a father for his son is at once funny, heartbreaking, and hopeful. In it a young man teaches his entire family "a new way to die" with wit, candor, and, remarkable grace. Richard Lischer's son, Adam, calls to tell his father, a professor of divinity at Duke University, that his cancer has returned. Despite the crushing magnitude of his diagnosis and the cruel course of the illness, Adam's growing weakness evokes in him an unexpected strength. This is the story of one last summer and the young man who lived it as honestly and faithfully as possible. We meet Adam in many phases of his growing up, but always through the narrow lens of his undying hope, when in the final season of his life he becomes his family's (and his father's) spiritual leader. Honest in its every dimension, Stations of the Heart is an unforgettable book about life and death and the terrible blessing of saying good-bye. We hope you'll join us to read and discuss this book, as it touches our own stories of grief and hope.

Christmas 2020

As we look towards the Advent season and the birth of Jesus we know that this will be a difficult time for many of you as this year you might not be gathering with family or traveling as usual. We hope that our celebrations online and on the radio will fill you with comfort, joy, and hope as they usually do when we are in person.

News from Our Local Salvation Army

Our lunch program runs M-F (noon-12:45), and we are serving more than double what we did pre-COVID. We are at 120 meals/day. This is open to everyone. Drive-up 'to-go' meals only. Some people have been getting meals and delivering to friends. If anyone wants more than 3 meals, we would like them to call before 10:00 am to make sure we have enough food. Our office number is 226-2241.

Our Food Pantry is a need-based program, based on income. Please call ahead to know what information they will need to bring with them to register. Our Food Pantry is back to our normal levels, but we are registering many new families who are impacted due to unemployment. We are concerned about our food supply, since the TV-6 Can-a-thon is virtual only, and this is our largest single food drive. If anyone can donate, they can send it in to us (desinated Can-a-thon) and we will report that to TV-6 as part of their numbers.

Christmas Toy shop will be held Dec 17-18 for families in need. (Need-based system by registration only) Families should register by Dec 4. Parents can come to the toy shop and select toys for their kids. This will be held at Westwood Mall in the old MC Sports location. We expect to serve over 1000 kids this year due to the need. If there is a COVID shutdown, we will bag toys for each family, and they will be handed out in a drive-up, no contact system. To support the toy shop, there is an on-line option at Walmart.com and going to "RegisterForGood". Toys purchased there will be shipped free to our address.

Adopt-a-family program is continuing. Families or businesses (or churches!) can adopt a family and shop directly for that family from a wish list. Families are chosen from our regular toy shop registrations.

We are running "Virtual Red Kettle" for those who are staying away from stores. They can scan a QR code, and it takes people directly to a donation page. Our QR code is below.

We really need volunteer and even paid bell ringers. To volunteer, go to RegisterToRing.com. Volunteers are eligible for gift cards to Jandron's Fine Jewelry for every two-hour shift they ring. We have two indoor locations this year, too. To become an employee from now until Christmas, stop in either of our offices for paperwork to fill out. Bring an ID and SS Card.
