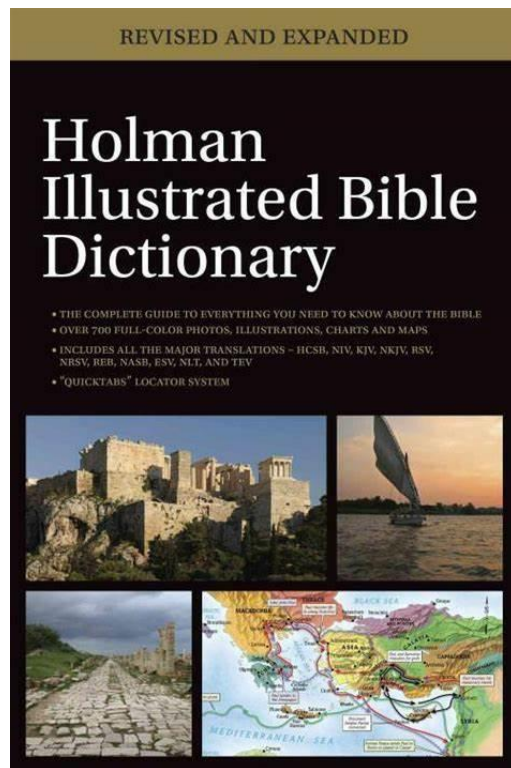

Propitiation: Satisfaction Of God's Wrath

Justification: Imputation Of God's Righteousness

Expiation: Atoning Reparation For The Sinner

Vicarious: Taking The Place For The Sinner

A. HE SUFFERED FOR US

**“This was to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah: He took our illnesses and bore our diseases.”

SUFFERING IS A CONSEQUENCE OF SIN

B. HE WAS SHAMED FOR US

“For I tell you that this Scripture must be fulfilled in me: And he was numbered with the transgressors. For what is written about me has its fulfillment” (Luke 23:37).

C. HE WAS SILENT FOR US

“Now the passage of the Scripture that he was reading was this: Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter and like a lamb before its shearer is silent, so he opens not his mouth” (Acts 8:32).

EXAMPLES OF HIS SILENCE

“But Jesus remained silent” (Matthew 26:53)

“But he remained silent and made no answer” (Mark 14:61)

“He gave no answer” (Matthew 27:12)

“But Jesus gave him no answer” (John 19:9)

JOHN 10:17-18

“For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life that I may take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. This charge I have received from my Father.”

D. HE WAS SINLESS FOR US

“He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth” (I Peter 2:22).

“For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God” (II Corinthians 5:21).

ROMANS 10:16

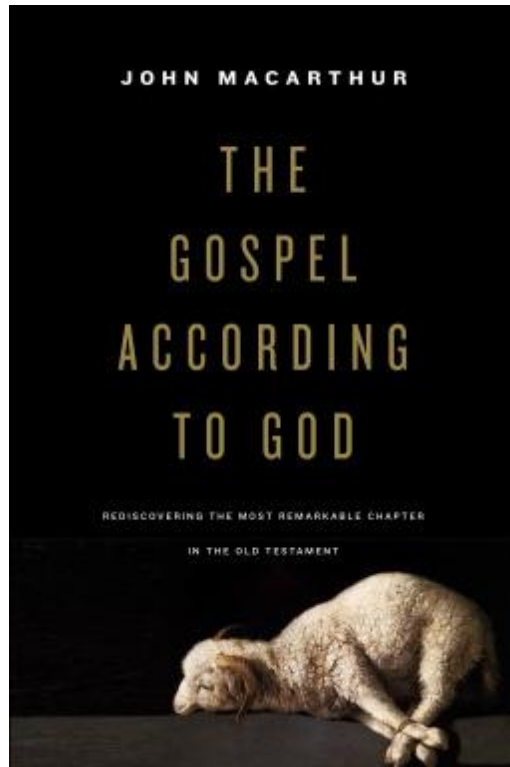
“But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Isaiah says, “Lord who has believed what he has heard from us?””
