Part 1: Coming in Truth, Ephesians 4: 17-32

By saying "Christmas is Coming" in our context for this sermon series, we don't mean let's get excited about the approaching event (although December 25th is fast upon us), but OUR APPROACH TO THE EVENT, i.e., how we live in light of Jesus' coming to this earth.

<u>TODAY'S TRUTH</u> Our celebration of the birth of Jesus should be about living in Him, living in His truth, as He is the truth.

QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION

Open: It's been said that "hindsight is 20/20." Give an example of one thing you know now that you wish you had known earlier in your life.

- 1. If a person did not have a dramatic "born again" experience in coming to Christ, how can he or she know that they are truly saved?
- 2. According to 4:17-19, how do the mind, heart and conscience influence the actions of non-believers?
- 3. If the "old man" is dead and removed at salvation (2 Cor. 5:17), why do we still struggle against sin?
- 4. What are some practical ways to be renewed in the spirit of your mind? Be specific.
- 5. What does "put on...put off" entail (4: 22-24)
- 6. Is it possible to change conduct without a transformation of the heart?
- 7. According to Paul, what specific actions distinguish the Christian lifestyle from the pagan lifestyle (4:25-32)? How well are you doing in reflecting these actions? What areas need the most help? Share and ask the group to pray for you.
