THE GATHERING OF THE COMMUNITY

Leader: Good morning. As we meet today, we begin by remembering the Songhees and Esquimalt nations, on whose traditional land we now gather in gratitude. We acknowledge their story and their stewardship of the land and the water, the plants, and the animals, through the many generations.

As we meet, we remember those who have called this place their home in recent years—the community of faith known as Church of the Advent. Let us share our joy in signs of welcome.

<u>Welcome</u>: Welcome to this service of worship on the Second Sunday of Advent and the Feast day of St. Nicholas, the patron saint of children and sailors. My name is Paul Schumacher, and I am the interim priest-in-charge here at the Church of The Advent, during this time of transition. We invite you to come and join our readers, prayer leaders, music director and choir members, along with our technical team, as we offer prayer and praise to our Creator. Come, come with your doubts, your strengths, your weaknesses, and your fears, for God loves us all and all are welcome in this space.

<u>Scripture Sentence of the Day</u>: Scripture shares with us, "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his path straight. All flesh shall see the salvation of God."

<u>Lighting of the Advent Candle:</u> Today, we light the second candle on the Advent wreath. The candle of Peace.

<u>Invitation</u>: We come to the second week of the season of Advent and gather around a wreath to light candles. The wreath reminds us of the circle of our human community and the lights illuminate the many ways in which we bring ourselves to the Incarnation, God's longed-for presence among us — human and holy, Emmanuel — God with us and God coming to us.

Scripture: Luke 2:11-14

But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for see – I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.' And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, Glory to God in the highest and peace on earth, good will to all!

Lighting the Candle and Illuminating the Stories of Hope:

(Light one purple/blue candle)

We light this candle for the Christmas story that shines hope on our lives.

(Light the second purple/blue candle)

We light this candle to shine on the places that bring us peace, including this church, and the places and people that need peace this day.

Naming Our Places of Peace: The Advent season reminds us that God chooses real places to meet us. Our hopes and fears are met, not in the clouds, but in the little town of Bethlehem.

We find peace in very real places – from a grandmother's kitchen, at the seashore, from a decorated street to a snowy backyard, to the roar of the ocean's waves against the shore. I invite you to consider those places and times in your life where you have found peace. Hold these memories in your heart as we pray for personal peace, community peace, global peace.

<u>Unison Prayer:</u> Emmanuel, we find peace in places near and far, expected and unexpected. Help us in this Advent season to pray for peace in our lives, our relationships, our communities, and our world. Amen.

But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and everything that is done on it will be disclosed.

Since all these things are to be dissolved in this way, what sort of people ought you to be in leading lives of holiness and godliness, waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set ablaze and dissolved, and the elements will melt with fire? But, in accordance with his promise, we wait for new heavens and a new earth, where righteousness is at home.

Therefore, beloved, while you are waiting for these things, strive to be found by him at peace, without spot or blemish; and regard the patience of our Lord as salvation. So also our beloved brother Paul wrote to you according to the wisdom given to him.
