

## OHE IS RISEN PAPER PLATE CRAFT

This will be a cool reminder that Jesus is risen from the dead.

You will need:

Paper plate

Markers, crayons or paint

Yellow paper, or white paper and a yellow crayon

Black cross\*see pattern below.

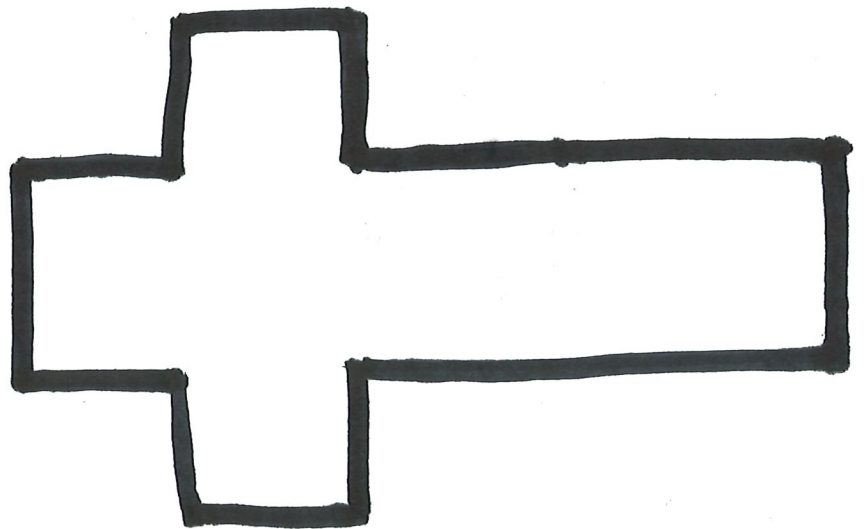
### INSTRUCTIONS

Cut out cross pattern and trace on black piece of paper. Cut out the cross and set aside.

Trace your right hand on the yellow paper and cut it out. Set it aside with the cross. If you only have white paper trace your hand and then colour it before you cut it out.

Take the paper plate and paint or colour as shown in the example.

If you used paint, let it dry. Then glue the hand on and the cross as the sample shows. You can write "He is Risen" on the green part. Get your parents to help if you need it.



### CROSSES ON A HILL INSTRUCTIONS

Use the cross pattern to make 3 crosses.

Use paint or crayons or markers to colour the top part of the 8 x 11 piece of paper.

Cut a hill out of black construction paper and glue it on.

Glue the crosses on the hill to make a silhouette.



### POP UP EASTER CARD

This craft will work best if you used card stock. These are the instructions for the card you see pictured below.

Use ½ of an 8 x 11 piece of card stock.

Use the template to cut in the right places to make the crosses pop when you open the card.

Decorate the card with stickers or sayings from The Bible Easter story like He is Risen, He is Risen Indeed,

### GOSPEL ADDITION

This one is pretty straight forward. It would make a nice card or poster on the wall for a reminder of what Jesus has done for you.



## EGG CARTON CROSS FOR TODDLERS

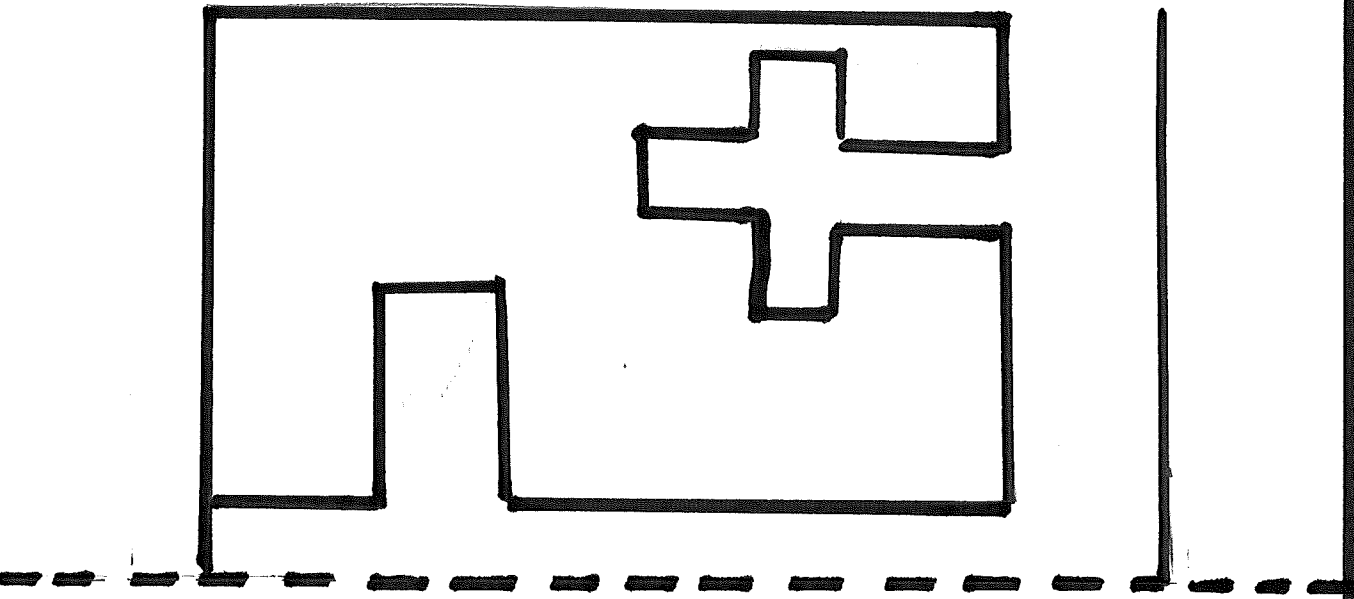
While everyone is doing crafts your toddler will want to be involved.

Here is a recipe for Salt dough.

Ingredients:

2 cups all purpose flour

1 cup salt

1 cup cold water

Directions

1. Mix flour and salt together in a bowl. Slowly mix water, a few tablespoons at a time, into flour mixture until dough is smooth and easy to handle. Knead dough for 10 mins, Let rest for 20 mins.
2. Preheat oven to 250 degrees F (120 degrees C)
3. Form dough into desired shapes and put on cookie sheets. You could roll out the dough as well and use cookie cutters to make Easter ornaments.
4. Bake until dry and hard. This can take 2 hours or more.
5. Cool completely
6. Paint our colour with markers. Or you could put food colouring right in the dough when mixing it.

I googled "Salt dough Easter crafts". There are so many things you can do with salt do to tell the story. Small children will enjoy participating in this as well.
