Lighting of the Advent Candles

the one promised from the beginning of the world. We thank God for the
hope Jesus gives us and for the peace he bestows.

Our peace is found in Christ.

Let us pray - O God of Peace, send your light into our hearts. Help us
prepare ourselves for the peace that you bring - the inner peace in our
hearts and the outer peace in the world. **Amen.**
