By saying "Christmas is Coming" in our context for this sermon series, we don't mean let's get excited about the approaching event (although December 25th is fast upon us), but OUR APPROACH TO THE EVENT, i.e., how we live in light of Jesus' coming to this earth.

<u>TODAY'S TRUTH</u> Our celebration of the birth of Jesus should be about loving Him, and loving like Him, rejecting a life that is not pleasing to Him.

1. IMITATE THE LORD

Ephesians 5:1 "Therefore be imitators of God as dear children."

2. INCARNATE LOVE

Ephesians 5:2 "And walk in love, as Christ also has loved us, and given Himself for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling aroma."

- Self-Sacrificing Rom.5:5, 1 John 4: 7-11
 - Costly, Caring, Consecrating
- Sweet Smelling 2 Cor. 2:15-16
 - Conspicuous

HOW DO WE LOVE OTHERS?

- Commit to the Glory of God Our main motivation in loving others
- Commit to the Lord's Supper Remember what Jesus did for us on the cross
- Commit to the Body of Christ, the Church Love is a commitment to seek one another's highest good.

3. BE INFORMED OF LOSTNESS

Ephesians 5:3 "But fornication and all uncleanness or covetousness, let it not even be named among you, as is fitting for saints;"

- Inappropriate Lifestyle 1 Timothy 1:10
- Inheritance Lost 1 Cor. 6: 9-11

QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION

Open: Will your Christmas celebration be different this year? Why or why not?

- 1. Can you give an example that you have "mimicked" your parents, or your children have mimicked you? How does that feel?
- 2. What does it mean to you to be a child of God? What evidence can you give that your heart has been changed?
- 3. Discuss what Paul means by "sweet smelling aroma." Dig: Look up the meaning in terms of the offerings in Leviticus 1-5. Read Philippians 4:18. What is an acceptable sacrifice?
- 4. How does Paul expect us to walk in love? Discuss Pastor Cole's list of "how to love others." Refer back to Ephesians 4:32 for further insights.
- 5. According to Paul, what actions separate the non-Christian lifestyle from the Christian lifestyle? What is the difference between foolish talk and coarse jesting (5:4) and a good clean joke and belly laugh?
- 6. How does "giving thanks" oppose the worldly lifestyle (5:4)?
- 7. What does being "deceived by empty words" (5:6) mean?
- 8. Please pray for CrossRoads, our unity, our ministry, and your involvement to help us all grow to "the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ."
