“Read the Land. Live the Book.” (Jerusalem University College T-Shirt)

In a way it doesn't seem possible that we are providing a sixth study tour to Israel. Back in 2008, Preston Pouteaux led our first “pilgrimage” to the Holy Land. Originally intended to be a “one and done” experience, it has developed into a broader venture for our congregation and others. We've gotten connected to different communities of faith, denominations and home places like Edmonton, Medicine Hat, Regina and beyond as we have journeyed together.

Next year we are “booked” to be a part of the Pastor/Parishioner Study Tour to Israel through Jerusalem University College. The experience begins here as we work on materials and maps that the school provides. Once we are in Israel, we will be led to a multitude of sites throughout the land by top-of-the-line instructors, such as Cindy Parker, Aubrey Taylor and Jack Beck. Oh, and by the way, Jack will be back for a third time to LCOS, January 13-14, 2018!

And the places we will go and the things we will see! Really too numerous to mention, but a few of them are: Church of the Holy Sepulchre (where a 4 million dollar restoration of the tomb of Jesus has just been completed), the City of David in Jerusalem, the site of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem, the Dead Sea, Masada, Jericho, the Sea of Galilee...and the list goes on.

This is truly a deeper experience than the usual bus tour. We will be usually walking around 6 miles/day, spending time “reading the land” so we can “live the Book.” And of course, we will be taking our Bibles with us as God's Word really comes alive.

But don't just take my word for it, ask some of our sisters and brothers who have been on previous study tours, such as Garry and Wendy Mihaichuk, Margaret Heimbigner, Alex Mckay, Ken and Pat Farn, Cliff Blumhagen, Tim and Janice Hawkings and Sophia Della Rosa, just to name a few.

We will be sharing an information session, for anyone who is interested in finding out more, on Sunday, April 2nd, after the 11 am. worship service.

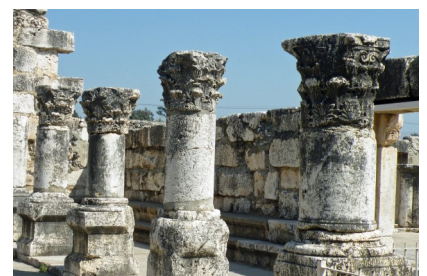

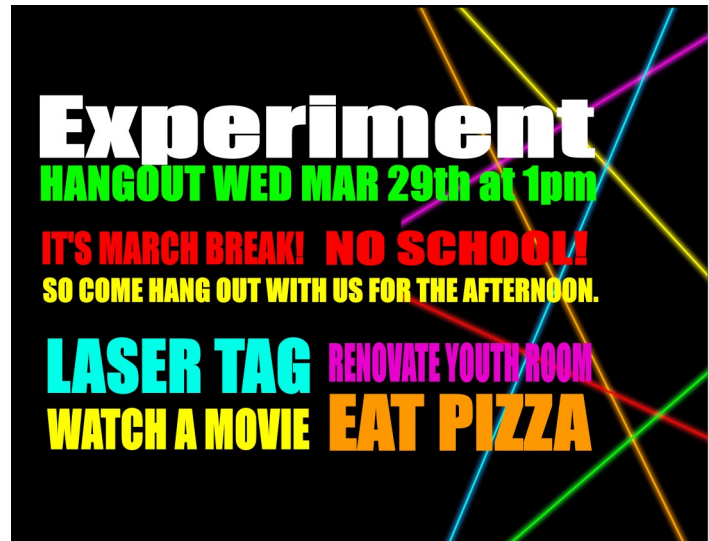
Youth & Children's Ministry—Upcoming Activities

It's March Break! No School! Come hang out with us for the afternoon as we play some laser tag, renovate the youth room, eat some pizza, and watch a movie!



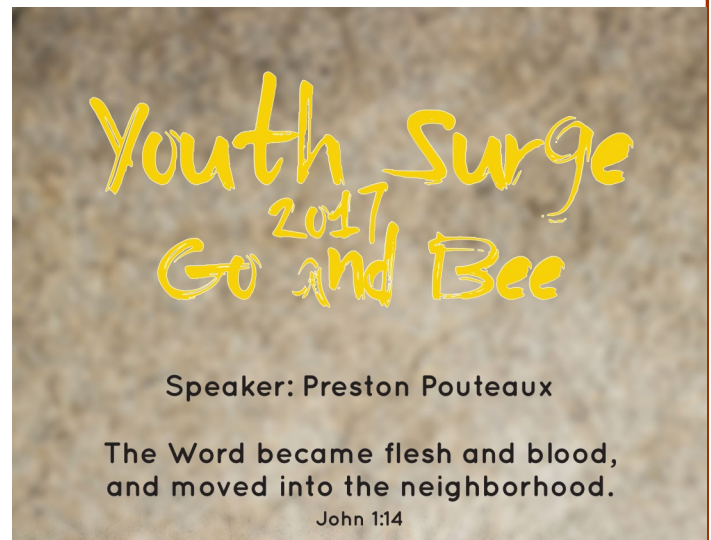

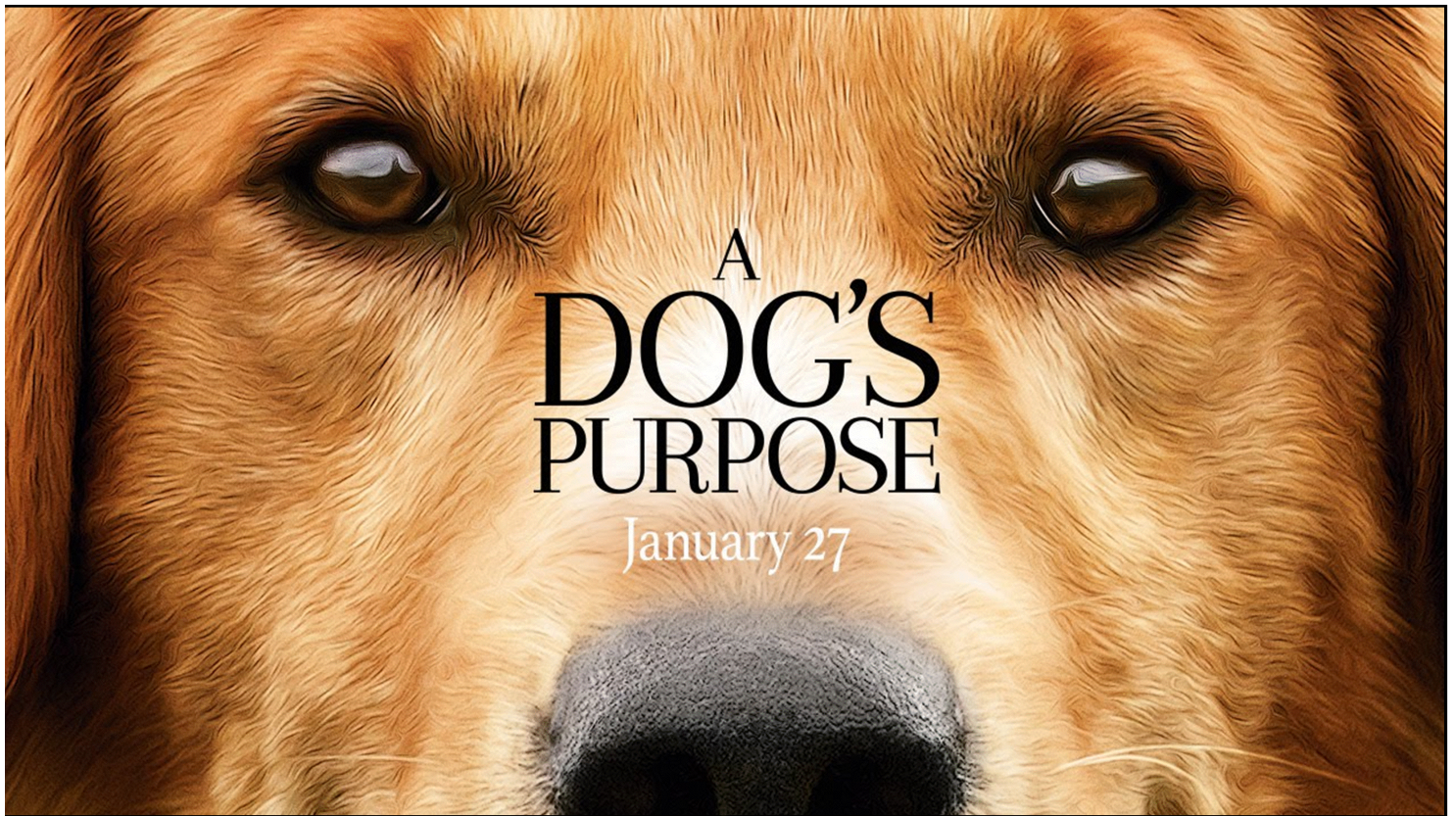

Lutheran Church of Our Saviour is once again pleased to support the Brenda Strafford Centre in two ways.

The first is by putting together special bags of necessities & gifts. There are many women who leave their homes with only the clothes on their back. These bags are gratefully received by these women, and long after the practical contents of the bag has passed, the caring bag serves as a reminder that the larger community is thinking about them and they're not alone.

The second is by providing a new pillow for each resident that comes into the shelter during the year. For sanitary reasons each resident must be given their own pillow to keep. For some of the children it is the first time they have ever had their own pillow.



So, take a bag from the Place of Welcome starting March 1st and fill it with items from the suggested list and next time you are out shopping consider throwing an extra pillow in your cart. All items can be placed in the donation cupboard by **Easter Sunday, April 16th.**

How to make a palm cross

- 1 Take a palm leaf about 2 feet long and 1/2" wide. If it is young, fold the palm lengthwise and the pointed end towards the center.
- 2 Then bend the top end down and toward you.
- 3 About a third of the way from the bend you just made, bend and crease palm diagonally.
- 4 About an inch away from the bend of the cross, bend the palm back behind the stem so that a new facing is your left. Make the bend at a good length to have the right arm of the cross.
- 5 Fold that same section at a point that is about the length of the right arm. Bend it on the left side and bring the end forward.
- 6 From the center of the cross, fold to the upper right so that the upper arm is about 45 degrees when the palm is flat.
- 7 Fold down and to the left behind the cross.
- 8 Fold from left to right behind the cross.
- 9 Turn the palm over and fold the right arm upward and to the left.
- 10 Turn the palm over and fold the left arm upward and to the right.
- 11 Turn the palm over and fold the right arm upward and to the left.
- 12 Turn the palm over and fold the left arm upward and to the right.
- 13 Turn the palm over and fold the right arm upward and to the left.
- 14 Turn the palm over and fold the left arm upward and to the right.
- 15 Turn the palm over and fold the right arm upward and to the left.
- 16 Turn the palm over and fold the left arm upward and to the right.

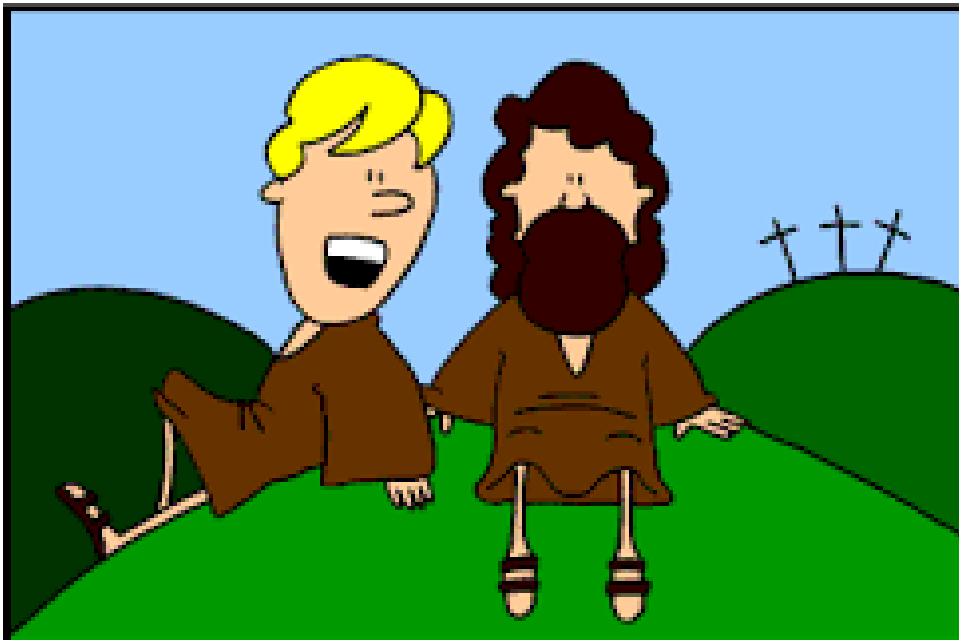

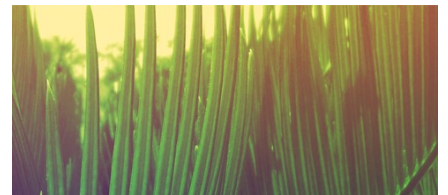

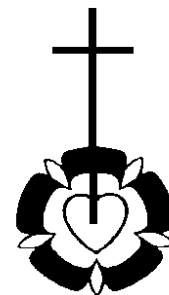

Message from the Bishop

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ –

*Ho, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters;
and you that have no money, come, buy and eat!
Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price.
Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread,
and your labour for that which does not satisfy?
Isaiah 55:1-2a*



My Lenten devotions this year have been in part focused on a set of compiled writings from Old Testament scholar, Walter Brueggemann: *A Way other than Our Own: Devotions for Lent*.

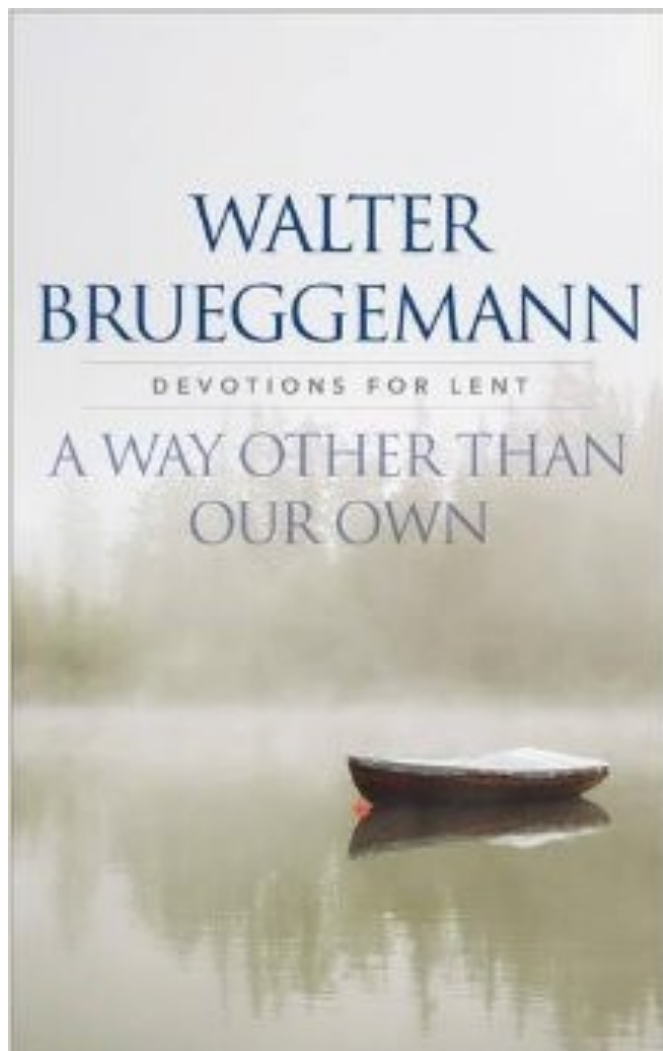
I have always found Brueggemann's writings to be thought-provoking, insightful and challenging. Perhaps, since it is the season of Lent and I am "open" in the season, I have found this compilation to be even more thought-provoking, even more insightful and even more challenging.

Reflecting on Isaiah 55:1-2a: Lent is a question. Lent is a gift. Lent is a summons.

The questions of Lent Brueggemann suggests are:

What are we doing?
Are we working for that which does not satisfy?
Are we spending for that which is not bread?

Thought-provoking.



The gifts of Lent are free, gifts in the gospel that sustain life. Free wine and milk. Free water and bread, and "all the markings of sacrament that refuse our thin attempts at empire" (pg. 11).

Insightful.

And challenging: The summons of Lent is to bear new fruit. To do what is in sync, in harmony, with the God of the good news, the God who has another intention for our lives, who wants us out of the rat-race of "big is better", "highest salary means most valuable", "the one with the most toys wins" and so has mercy, who gives us pardon when we do not do enough by doing two things at once.

We are left, dear sisters and brothers, with "a new sense of ourselves as God's people: no longer working for that which does not satisfy; receiving good gifts that we need for life; engaging in a new productivity of that which heals and transforms" (pg. 11).

Research Assistance on Kitchen Update Required



If you work in the kitchen you may have noticed our stoves and fridges are somewhat advanced in age. One of our ovens really is almost to the point of unusable. Over the last year several memorial donations have been made with the intent of improving the situation.

We are presently looking for one or two people that would be willing to spend some time researching different appliance options and reporting back with a couple of choices by June 1st. Some of the questions you might choose to ask are:

- 1) Can we find a similar configuration that just fits ?
- 2) Are there better options that do not require a kitchen re-model and permit applications?
- 3) What would the people that use the kitchen like to see?

In addition, we must move to a garbage/recycling/organic recycling system this fall. At the present time we have a garbage can in the kitchen and recycling around the corner. With the addition of organic recycling a new more user friendly system needs to be set up. We would appreciate a bit of thought and research into suggestions on what type of containers and where they should go.

Financials

Get on PAR (Pre-Authorized Remittance) at LCOS

Did you know that you may give to LCOS via pre-authorized remittance one time per month from your bank or credit union chequing account? This program is like any other pre-authorized debit program and is called the PAR (Pre-Authorized Remittance) program. Debits will be drawn from accounts on the 20th of each month. Whenever the 20th falls on a weekend or holiday, the debits will be drawn on the first business day following the 20th. Donations via the PAR program will be recorded on quarterly statements and year-end tax receipts along with all other giving.

Amounts from PAR can be directed to:

- 1) The LCOS general budget
- 2) Canadian Lutheran World Relief (CLWR)
- 3) Capital Maintenance

You can give additional amounts and to other purposes via your regular donation envelopes. The minimum amount to give via this program is a total of \$50.00 per month.

You can sign up, make banking or donation amount changes, or withdraw from the program at any time. These changes will be effective the month following the submission of the change. Forms are available to process these changes. The program is administered by the Financial Secretary. Authorization forms are available in the Place of Welcome.
