About Ordination of Bishops, Priests & Deacons

"The Holy Scriptures and ancient Christian writers make it clear that from the apostles' time there have been different ministries within the Church. In particular, since the time of the New Testament, three distinct orders of ordained ministers have been characteristic of Christ's holy catholic church. First, there is the order of bishops who carry on the apostolic work of leading, supervising, and uniting the Church. Secondly, associated with them are presbyters, or ordained elders, in subsequent times generally known as priests. Together with the bishops, they take part in the governance of the Church, in the carrying out of its missionary and pastoral work, and in the preaching of the word of God and the administration of the holy sacraments. Thirdly, there are deacons who, in addition to assisting bishops and priests in all this work, have a special responsibility to minister in Christ's name to the poor, the sick, the suffering and the helpless." (Book of Alternative Services, p. 631)

Baptism is the foundation of all ministries. At this ordination you will witness many signs and symbols and hear many words about the ministries of deacons and priests. The purpose of all ordained ministry is God's mission to the world, which is exercised by the whole people of God so that all might know of the grace and love of God we have received in Jesus Christ our Lord. May this liturgy strengthen us in God's call and be an instrument to build up the church and empower our ministries.

Silence for Reflection

The Nicene Creed

All

Let us confess our faith, as we say,

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty,

maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God,

eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light,

true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father.

Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,

and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father.

With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified.

He has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Presentation

The Archbishop & people sit.

The presenters, standing before the Archbishop, present the ordinands, saying:

Melissa, bishop in the Church of God,

on behalf of the people of the Diocese of New Westminster,

we present you Lorie

to be ordained deacon in Christ's holy catholic Church.

Archbishop Has she been selected in accordance

with the canons and customs of this Church? And do you believe her manner of life to be suitable to the exercise of this ministry?

Presenters We certify to you that Lorie has been duly selected,

and we believe her to be qualified for the diaconate.

The Archbishop says to the ordinand:

Will you be loyal to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of Christ

as this Church has received them?

And will you, in accordance with the canons of this Church,

obey your bishop and other ministers

who may have authority over you and your work?

The ordinand answers:

I am willing and ready to do so;

and I solemnly declare that I do believe the holy scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the word of God,

and to contain all things necessary to salvation;

and I do solemnly promise to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of the Anglican Church of Canada.

The ordinand signs the Declaration, Oath & Subscriptions.

All stand.

The Archbishop says to the people:

Dear friends in Christ, you know the importance of this ministry,

and the weight of your responsibility in presenting Lorie

for ordination to the sacred order of deacons.

Therefore, if any of you know any impediment or crime

for which we should not proceed, come forward now and make it known.

If no objection is made, the Archbishop continues:

Archbishop Is it your will that she be ordained?

All It is.

Archbishop Will you uphold her in this ministry?

All We will.

Examination

All now sit except the ordinand, who stands before the Archbishop.

The Archbishop addresses those to be ordained deacon.

Lorie, every Christian is called to follow Jesus Christ,

serving God the Father, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

God now calls you to a special ministry of servanthood,

directly under the authority of your Archbishop.

In the name of Jesus Christ, you are to serve all people, particularly the poor, the weak, the sick, and the lonely.

As a deacon in the Church, you are to study the holy scriptures, to seek nourishment from them, and to model your life upon them.

You are to make Christ and his redemptive love known, by your word and example,

to those among whom you live and work and worship.

You are to interpret to the Church the needs, concerns, and hopes of the world.

You are to assist the Archbishop and priests in public worship,

and in the ministration of God's word and sacraments,

and you are to carry out other duties assigned to you from time to time.

At all times, your life and teaching are to show Christ's people that in serving the helpless they are serving Christ himself.

Do you believe that you are truly called by God and his Church

to the life and work of a deacon?

Answer I believe I am so called.

Archbishop Do you now in the presence of the Church

commit yourself to this trust and responsibility?

Answer I do.

Archbishop Will you respect and be guided

by the pastoral direction and leadership of our bishop?

Answer I will.

Archbishop Will you be faithful in prayer,

and in the reading and study of the holy scriptures?

Answer I will.

Archbishop Will you look for Christ in all others,

being ready to help and serve those in need?

Answer I will.

Archbishop Will you do your best to pattern your life and that of your family

in accordance with the teachings of Christ,

so that you may be a wholesome example to your people?

Answer I will.

Archbishop Will you in all things seek not your glory

but the glory of the Lord Christ?

Answer I will.

Archbishop May the Lord by his grace

uphold you in the service to which you are called.

Answer Amen.

Now all stand except the ordinand, who kneels before the Archbishop.

The Archbishop calls the people to prayer.

In peace let us pray to the Lord.

Cantor God the Father,

All Have mercy on us.

Cantor God the Son,
All Have mercy on us.

Cantor God the Holy Spirit,
All Have mercy on us.

Cantor Holy Trinity, one God,
All Have mercy on us.

Cantor We pray to you, Lord Christ.

All Lord, hear our prayer.

Cantor For the holy Church of God, that it may be filled with truth and love,

and be found without fault at the day of your coming,

we pray to you, O Lord.

All Lord, hear our prayer.

Cantor For all members of your Church in their vocation and ministry,

that they may serve you in a true and godly life,

we pray to you, O Lord.

All Lord, hear our prayer.

Cantor For Melissa, our Archbishop and Metropolitan,

and for all bishops, priests, and deacons, that they may be filled with your love,

may hunger for truth, and may thirst after righteousness,

we pray to you, O Lord.

All Lord, hear our prayer.

Cantor For Lorie chosen deacon in your Church,

we pray to you, O Lord.

All Lord, hear our prayer.

Cantor That she may faithfully fulfil the duties of this ministry,

build up your Church, and glorify your name,

we pray to you, O Lord.

All Lord, hear our prayer.

Cantor That by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit

she may be sustained and encouraged to persevere to the end,

we pray to you, O Lord.

All Lord, hear our prayer.

Cantor For all who fear God and believe in you, Lord Christ,

that our divisions may cease and that all may be one,

as you and the Father are one,

we pray to you, O Lord.

All Lord, hear our prayer.

Cantor For the mission of the Church, that in faithful witness

it may preach the gospel to the ends of the earth,

we pray to you, O Lord.

All Lord, hear our prayer.

Cantor For those who do not yet believe,

and for those who have lost their faith,

that they may receive the light of the gospel,

we pray to you, O Lord.

All Lord, hear our prayer.

Cantor For ourselves: for the forgiveness of our sins,

and for the grace of the Holy Spirit to amend our lives,

we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear our prayer.

Cantor For all who have died in the communion of the Church,

and those whose faith is known to you alone, that, with all the saints,

they may have rest in that place where there is no pain or grief, but life eternal,

we pray to you, O Lord.

Cantor Rejoicing in the fellowship of all the saints,

let us commend ourselves, and one another,

and all our life to Christ our God.

Almighty and eternal God,

and strengthen us to do your will; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Please kneel as you are able.

Reader Veni Creator Spiritus

Come, Holy Ghost, our souls inspire and lighten with celestial fire; thou the anointing Spirit art, who dost thy seven-fold gifts impart.

Thy blessed unction from above is comfort, life and fire of love; enable with perpetual light the dullness of our blinded sight.

Anoint and cheer our soilèd face with the abundance of thy grace; keep far our foes, give peace at home; where thou art guide no ill can come.

Teach us to know the Father, Son, and thee, of both, to be but one: that through the ages all along this may be our endless song: praise to thy eternal merit, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Consecration of a Deacon

The ordinand comes forward to stand with the Archbishop.

The Archbishop stands with the ordinand before her & begins this Prayer of Consecration:

We praise and glorify you, most merciful God,

because in your great love of our human race

you sent your only Son Jesus Christ to take the form of a servant;

he came to serve and not to be served;

and to teach us that one who would be great among us must be the servant of all;

he humbled himself for our sake,

and in obedience accepted death, even death on a cross;

therefore you highly exalted him and gave him the name which is above every name.

And now we give you thanks that you have called this your servant to share this ministry entrusted to your Church.

Here the Archbishop lays her hands on the head of the ordinand:

Send down your Holy Spirit upon your servant Lorie whom we now consecrate in your name to the office and work of a deacon in the Church.

The Archbishop continues:

Almighty God, give to this your servant grace and power to fulfill her ministry.

Make her faithful to serve, ready to teach, and constant to advance your gospel; and grant that always having full assurance of faith, abounding in hope, and being rooted and grounded in love, she may continue strong and steadfast in your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and your Holy Spirit, belong glory and honour, worship and praise, now and for ever.

Amen.

The Anointing Archbishop

Lorie, I anoint you with holy oil. May the grace of Christ fill you, may the power of Christ sustain you, may the love of Christ lead you

that you may fulfill and maintain the vows you have made this day. In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The new deacon is now vested according to the order of deacons.

The Archbishop hands a Bible to the newly ordained deacon, saying:

Receive this Bible as a sign of your authority to proclaim God's word

and to assist in the ministration of God's holy sacraments.

The Archbishop presents the newly ordained to the congregation & invites their welcome.

The Peace

Archbishop The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All And also with you.

Sending Out of the Disciples

Archbishop O God,

Your compassion has broken on us like the dawn;

guide now our feet into the way of peace

All We pray that Lorie

may be to us a godly example in word and action,

in love and patience, and in holiness of life.

Grant that we, with her, may serve you now,

and always rejoice in your glory;

through Jesus Christ your Son, our Lord,

who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit,

one God, now and for ever. Amen.
