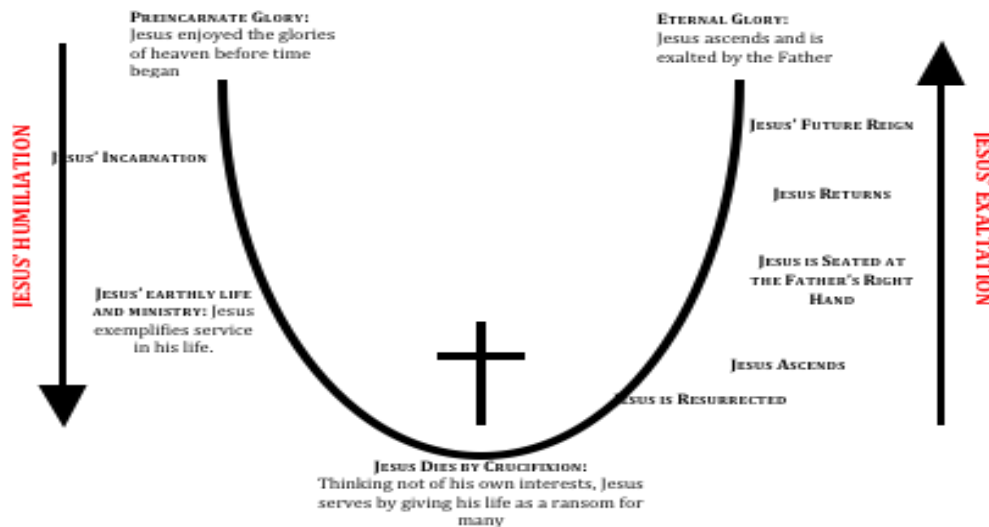

3. \_\_\_\_\_ perspective – Defeat of the accuser (Rev 12:11)
4. \_\_\_\_\_ perspective – Debt has been paid (Colossians 2:14)
5. \_\_\_\_\_ perspective – Supreme standard of behavior (Philippians 2:5)
