From the Rector – Living as Disciples

²⁰ That, however, is not the way of life you learned ²¹ when you heard about Christ and were taught in him in accordance with the truth that is in Jesus. ²² You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; ²³ to be made new in the attitude of your minds; ²⁴ and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness. *Ephesians 4:20-24*

When I became a Christian in the late 1990's for teenage Christians there was one thing that was all the rage – WWJD bracelets (What Would Jesus Do?). Every kid at youth group had one, with the competition of whose colour was the best raging fierce. As I've grown as a Christian, having now been part of different churches, I've realised that the challenge to live life as Jesus would has been a profound base for my life as a disciple of his. I've also grown to understand that the church is indeed a body – a complex network of relationships. Within that network of relationships comes great joy, as well as conflict. No wonder Jesus and the writers of the New Testament spent so much time talking about working together to resolve conflict.

So, let me present some areas of life for you to think about WWJD in these scenarios:

- How you talk about others
- How you deal with conflict

Electoral Rolls

The Electoral Roll for the Parish is now available in each Church Centre. Please read the conditions on the top of each page and, if you are eligible to enrol, fill in your details. Having signed the roll then permits you to vote at the Parish A.G.M. which will be held late September. Please ensure your entitlement to vote is valid.

Nominations for Parish Council

Nomination forms for election onto the Parish Council are available. People who are eligible enrolled on the Electoral Roll are entitled to nominate for a position or nominate another person for a position on the Parish Council. Please help us have to best people in the Parish on the Parish Council for the next 12 months. The positions of Synod Representative and Nomination Committee are also open for the next 3 years.

Safe Church

If you have any roll in the Parish which may have any connection with children, you must have a Safe Church Communities Endorsement and an up-to-date Card for the State Government (W.W.C.V.P.). If you are a leader in any group or activity in the Parish you must have a Safe Church Communities Endorsement. Please ensure you are fully qualified and advise the Parish Office of your endorsement.

PARISH AGM 30th September 2018

The **Annual General Meeting** of the Parish is scheduled for 11.15am Sunday **30th September** at St George's Church, Sorell, following the 10am service. Electoral Rolls for the Parish are being distributed to all centres and all eligible members of the congregation are urged to sign the roll at your centre. Details of eligibility to sign onto the roll are provided at the top of each page of the roll.

From the parishioners listed on the roll, nominations will be called for (a) People's Wardens (2); (b) Parish Councillors (number to be selected at the A.G.M but usually includes at least 1 person from each centre); (c) Lay Synod Representatives (3); members of the Nomination Committee (3) and Parish Mission Representative(s). Nomination forms are being distributed.

Reports from the Rector and other Ministry officers will be presented at the A.G.M. as will reports from the Parish Wardens, Parish Council and other parish organisations.

An audited Financial Report for 2017/18 will be presented as will a Budget for 2018/19.
