- ⁴⁹ For you, the Almighty, have done great things for me, and holy is your Name.
- ⁵⁰ Your mercy reaches from age to age for those who fear you.
- ⁵¹ You have shown strength with your arm. You have scattered the proud in their conceit;
- ⁵² You have deposed the mighty from their thrones and raised the lowly to high places.

Scripture is our song for the journey, passed on from Generation to Generation to guide and inspire.

God calls us to be doers of the word and not hearers only.

Message/Reflections

Gaudete Sunday is the third Sunday of Advent. Gaudete is Latin for "Rejoice." On this Sunday we hear faith stories about being noisily thankful for what we have.

In the midst of the blue of waiting and preparation, we see a splash of pink, of Joy to remind us to stop and give thanks.

Theologian, Henri Nouwen, said that the difference between joy and happiness is that happiness depends on things and events while joy is "the experience of knowing that you are unconditionally loved and that nothing – sickness, failure, emotional distress, oppression war or even death – can take that love away."⁵

In 2014, Pope Francis said that, on the Sunday of Joy instead of fretting about all that hadn't been done to prepare for Christmas, people should "think of all the good things life has given you."

We are finding ourselves in a time and place where we are fretting about all the things that we can't do for Christmas. We are frustrated that we can't travel, or be together, of share the egg nog, or Grandma's Christmas Pudding and shortbread. Our world has been turned upside down and it is hard to know what we can do, when it seems as though there is so much we can't do.

This Sunday of Joy and Rejoicing is so very well placed to remind us to stop and give thanks for what we do have. We are to remember that our happiness is not – or shouldn't be – wrapped up in things.

We are to remember that we are loved, and loved well, by God.

Nothing can take that love away. How we may experience it in this time of separation and compassion and community caring may be different, but the love is still there.

Our focus scripture for this day of Joy is the Magnificat – the Song of Mary.

Remember her story? The young girl finding herself expecting a child out of wedlock in a time and place where it could have cost her her life? Imagine the worry and panic and fear she must have felt when this happened... (don't tell me Not to Be Afraid, Angels) would she be abandoned? would she be killed? who would believe that this was a gift from God?

For whatever reason, she went to visit a relative – away from home, away from comfort, perhaps away from prying eyes and gossips.

While she was there, this young woman – having experienced fear and looking into an unfamiliar road ahead, stopped to give thanks.

She stopped to name her faith and trust that with God all would be well. She looked around at all the good that was done in life around her. She acknowledged God's gifts and trust in her and her trust in God, but much of her thanksgiving was for others not herself.

As we hear her story, and look at our own unfolding, topsy turvy story, we might wonder how she could give thanks for being placed in a position of such vulnerability, or such uncertainty? What would we do in her position?

I would hope that we could stop and feel our faith: feel the love of God that surrounds us when we need it the most; know that in the worst of times God is standing with us,

holding us, encouraging us to care for others even in our own troubles.

On this Sunday of Joy and Rejoicing, I invite us to delve into our hearts and our heads to a place that can lift us beyond our current boundaries to feel and be the love of God.

to be loudly grateful for those people who hold us up and hold us together,

to look to what can be and should be done for the sake of others so that they are not abandoned but cared for with great compassion

to look at what we do have – no matter how small it may be - and be grateful for it

The energetic and exultant words of the prophet push us toward moving from a sense of exile to gratitude, reminding us that we can, indeed, be respite, be a safe haven, give of ourselves for the sake and safety of others, be the bringers of love and joy to someone else in our attitude, in our faith, with God's love.

When the world turns upside down, God is there. When the world turns upside down, God is here. When God's people need care we are to be there and here too.

With the courage and joy of young Mary as our example, let us look forward with gratitude for what we do have and not dwell on what we are missing.

Are we ready to have our eyes, ears and hearts opened to see the possibilities to love and be loved before us?

Joy is found in the love of God shared with us and by us. Let us loudly rejoice, with words and actions that we know, in a world that is, at times, incomprehensible to us
God is with us in all ways and places. Thanks be to God.
