Sermon Summary: September 16, 2018

Matthew 14:22–33 Stepping out of the Boat

- We will focus on the story of how Peter was called by God to move from merely believing "about" Him, to believing "in" Him. (Matthew 14:22-33)
 - If you have not yet put your complete trust and faith in Jesus, then you must take a risk and step out of the comfort of the boat.
- After Peter initially steps out of the boat and starts walking towards Jesus, he begins to become aware of the reality of the risk he is taking and he becomes afraid and begins to lose faith and sink.
 - God often calls us to step out of the boat in faith but we get afraid and lose our faith so easily.
- When Peter begins to sink, something amazing happens: Jesus reaches out and catches Peter by the hand and brings him to safety.
- Ultimately, we should keep in mind that at the very end of the story we read Peter is worshiping Jesus saying boldly, "Truly You are the Son of God."
