## What Kind of Banquet Is It?

o God Himself. This the kind of banquet/table that is Psalm 23:5a, "You prepare a panquet" (GWT).
<ul> <li>The Hebrew word translated as "prepare" is [קְשֹׁשַׁה, taarokh]. It means "to arrange in order, to set in order." It is used to refer to arranging weapons in order for battle. To arrange one's words in legal case, as an attorney does. It was also used to refer to arranging dishes in order for a meal on a table.</li> <li>The Hebrew word used here is [קַיְלְהָן, Shulchan]. This word is used to refer to theThis is one of those really long tables you see in a castle, in a medieval castle. It's long, holds 50, 100 people, where a feast is prepared for the king/queen and his/her quests.</li> <li>In some of the finest sheep country in the world, especially in the western United States and southern Europe, the high plateaus of the sheep ranges are always referred to as mesas—the Spanish word for tables. Oddly enough the Kiswahili (African) word for a table is also mesa. In many countries for thousands of years, the people living there refer to a as a "table or tableland," which sheep love to graze upon.</li> <li>A shepherd would go scout out the areas where he planned to take his sheep he would note where the predators were; where they hid, and what kind of predators they were. This was called "" by shepherds. Once prepared, he would take his sheep to the flat, plateau "table or tableland" to graze on the grass there.</li> </ul>
