Sunday, December 20, 2020 4th Sunday of Advent

We enter today into the 4th and last Sunday of Advent. The waiting period of preparing our hearts and minds for the birth of Christ is coming to an end. However, Christmas isn't here yet, we are still waiting! The 4th Sunday of Advent brings the wonderful, hoped for theme of "Love!" We have had Hope, Peace, Joy, and now Love. The popular wedding verse from First Corinthians "now these three remain faith, hope and love. The greatest of these is love!" May you feel God's deepest love as we move closer to Christmas.

Our Gospel lesson today from Luke chapter 2 tells of one of the most famous Bible verses ever! The angel Gabriel visits Mary to announce that she will be with child, and to name the child Jesus, because he will save us from our sins! And how does Mary respond? "Let it be!" This is our response as well to God's call in this last week of Advent. In this time of waiting and preparing our hearts for Christmas! "Let it be!" Similar to that famous Beatles song by the same name!

Let it be, oh God, as we have no control. Let it be, oh, God as we have no control and life is not up to me! And then Paul winds up his Book of Romans, in our second lesson, with this same theme: "Now to God who is able to strengthen you according to the Gospel...of Jesus Christ....to the only wise God, through Jesus Christ, to whom be the glory forever. Amen! (Romans 16: 25-27)



INTRODUCTION and WELCOME

God keeps the promise made to David to give him an everlasting throne. The angel tells Mary that God will give David's throne to her son Jesus. She is perplexed by Gabriel's greeting and by the news of her coming pregnancy, but she is able still to say, "Count me in." We who know that Jesus is called king only as he is executed still find it a mystery hard to fathom, but with Mary today we hear the news of what God is up to and say, "Count us in."

Lighting the Fourth Advent Candle

WORD

First Reading: 2 Samuel 7:1-11, 16

Instead of David building a house (temple) for God, God promises to establish David's house (dynasty) forever. Centuries later, after the Babylonian exile, no king sat on the throne. Even then, however, the people of Israel remembered this promise and continued to hope for a king, the messiah, God's anointed.

I Now when the king was settled in his house, and the Lord had given him rest from all his enemies around him, 2 the king said to the prophet Nathan, "See now, I am living in a house of cedar, but the ark of God stays in a tent." 3 Nathan said to the king, "Go, do all that you have in mind; for the Lord is with you."

4 But that same night the word of the Lord came to Nathan: 5 Go and tell my servant David: Thus says the Lord: Are you the one to build me a house to live in? 6 I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent and a tabernacle. 7 Wherever I have moved about among all the people of Israel, did I ever speak a word with any of the tribal leaders of Israel, whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, saying, "Why have you not built me a house of cedar?" 8 Now therefore thus you shall say to my servant David: Thus says the Lord of hosts: I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep to be prince over my people Israel; 9 and I have been with you wherever you went, and have cut off all your enemies from before you; and I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. 10 And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may live in their own place, and be disturbed no more; and evildoers shall afflict them no more, as formerly, 11 from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel; and I will give you rest from all your enemies. Moreover the Lord declares to you that the Lord will make you a house. 16 Your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me; your throne shall be established forever.

Psalm: Psalm 89:1-4, 19-26

Your love, O Lord, forever will I sing. (Ps. 89:1)

- 1 Your love, O Lord, forever will I sing; from age to age my mouth will proclaim your faithfulness.
- 2 For I am persuaded that your steadfast love is established forever; you have set your faithfulness firmly in the heavens.
- 3 "I have made a covenant with my chosen one; I have sworn an oath to David my servant:
- 4 'I will establish your line forever, and preserve your throne for all generations.' "
- 19 You spoke once in a vision and said to your faithful people:
 - "I have set the crown upon a warrior and have exalted one chosen out of the people.
- 20 I have found David my servant; with my holy oil have I anointed him.
- 21 My hand will hold him fast and my arm will make him strong.
- 22 No enemy shall deceive him, nor shall the wicked bring him down.
- 23 I will crush his foes before him and strike down those who hate him.
- 24 My faithfulness and steadfast love are with him, and he shall be victorious through my name.
- 25 I will set his hand on the sea, and his right hand on the rivers.
- 26 He will say to me, 'You are my father, my God, and the rock of my salvation.'

Second Reading: Romans 16:25-27

Paul closes his letter to the Romans by praising God because, in the proclamation of the gospel of Jesus Christ, God has revealed the promised, divine plan of salvation for all humanity. Paul proclaims this gospel of Christ in order to bring about the obedience of faith among all nations.

25 Now to God who is able to strengthen you according to my gospel and the proclamation of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery that was kept secret for long ages 26 but is now disclosed, and through the prophetic writings is made known to all the Gentiles, according to the command of the eternal God, to bring about the obedience of faith—27 to the only wise God, through Jesus Christ, to whom be the glory forever! Amen.

The word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

Gospel: Luke 1:26-38

In this annunciation, Luke makes clear that God comes with good news for ordinary people from little known places. This king will not be born to royalty in a palace, but to common folk in a stall. Here Luke highlights the role of the Spirit, a special emphasis in this gospel.

26 In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, 27 to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. 28 And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." 29 But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. 30 The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. 31 And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. 32 He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. 33 He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." 34 Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" 35 The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. 36 And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. 37 For nothing will be impossible with God." 38 Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.

The Gospel of our Lord, praise to you, O Christ.



CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

SERMON

A group of children were asked what it means to "love?" Here are their answers:

"When someone loves you, the way they say your name is different. You just know that your name is safe in their mouth."

"When my grandmother had arthritis and could not paint her toenails, my grandfather did it for her. That's love!"

"Love is when you tell a guy you love his shirt, and he wears it everyday!"

"Love is when your puppy licks your face"

"When you love somebody, your eyelashes go up and down and little stars come out of you!"

"Love is what's in the room with you at Christmas if you stop opening presents and listen!" (Bobby, age 7).

Love is our theme today for this Fourth Sunday of Advent. Our Advent journey is toward the end and today we light all 4 candles on our Advent wreath. Recall we have had 4 themes during our Advent journey: Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. The themes help us move through the Advent season and we know we can essentially say that Jesus is our Advent Journey. Jesus is Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. We know that from John 3:16!

The love of God comes to us in the form of Jesus Christ! Love came down from Heaven on Christmas Eve in Jesus, the babe born in the manger. The "set up" to this story is our Gospel today from Luke 2 as the angel Gabriel meets Mary. The angel greets her just like God greets us today! First thing said is "Greetings Favored one! The Lord is with you" (Luke 1:28) and God believes you and I are "favored" or loved! And the angel said "Lord is with you." This is reference to the promise coming from Matthew chapter I with a name given to Jesus "Emmanuel". The word means "God with us!"

The angel goes on to tell Mary about God's plan that she is to name the baby Jesus. Gabriel says that God will give Jesus the throne of David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever. These are Old Testament references to solidify the connection back to King David. The angel goes on to say "nothing will be impossible with God" and Mary answers "Here am I, the servant of the Lord, let it be with me according to your word." Her answer "Let it be" is such a wonderful response.

And couldn't we, the broken hearted, worn out children of God say the same thing? Lord, for all the problems in my life, let it be! Lord, for all the struggles, the anxiety and worry and depression "Let it be!" We don't have control friends, and life will not go directly as we want...we all have to just "Let it be!" When we lay it down at the manger, Jesus promised to take that heavy load and die for it only to rise again. This is love, that God sent his only son to take our sin and problems, and worries, and anxieties away from us.

Love is summed up in the way Paul ends his Romans letter today in our Second Reading. "Now to God who is able to strengthen you according to the Gospel, and the proclamation of Jesus Christ to the only wise God, through Jesus Christ, to whom be the glory forever!"


