Advent Call to Worship: December Solstice

(light two blue candles, and also the pink candle)

We have lit three candles - for hope, for peace, and for joy. Today we also light the fourth candle - the candle of love. (light another blue candle)

With this flame we signify the love of God that surrounds and fills us at all times; and recognize in a special way in the Christmas story.

There is no greater power than love. It is stronger than rulers and empires, stronger than grief or despair, straonger even than death.

We love because God loves.

What gift of love have you received from someone else?

(Pause to respond, silently or aloud)

Loving God, we open ourselves to you this Christmas season.

As these candles are lit, light our lives with your imagination.

Show us the creative power of hope. Teach us the peace that comes from justice. Fill us with the kind of joy that cannot be contained, but must be shared. Magnify your love within us.
