2 Message Introduction

Today we will look at two sisters sharing their hearts about the problem with plastic pollution. Plastic pollution has become one of the most pressing environmental issues. And plastic trash has become so overwhelmed that it has alarmed the world to make changes immediately.

We learned from the last two weeks that God loves His creation and He called us to take care of it. We also learned that our instinct to consume has resulted in producing excessive waste and pollution in the world. When we learn that plastic pollution is one of the most pervasive pollution, let us understand this problem and be encouraged to make changes to help take care of God's creation.

4 SCRIPTURE READING

You may think the environmental issues are too great for kids and teens to make an impact. Read a parable told by Jesus Matthew 25:14-30

- 1. The man in the parable went on a journey. According to what criteria did he entrust his property to his servants? (v. 15)
- 2. How did each servant respond and why? (v. 16, 17 and 18)
- 3. When the man returned and found out that two of his servants made more money, what did the man

- say to these two servants? (v. 21 and 23)
- 4. What reason did the last servant say to his master for not making any money? (v. 24 and 25)
- 5. What was the master's response to the last servant? (v. 26)

Jesus reminded us through this parable that God has entrusted us with responsibilities according to our ability. Each of us, no matter what is our age, can make a difference. Ignorance or laziness is not an excuse.



5 How can we respond?

Small change can make a huge impact. Teens and adults, by working together, can be good stewards and responsible World's Caretakers.

Stop using the Big 4: single use shopping bag, drinking cup δ lid, water bottle and straw.

Start using reusable shopping bags, cups, water bottles and straws.
