1. It is necessary for our preaching and confessions to be verified

1 Conrinthains 15:14-15, Acts 2:36, 1 Corinthians 1:23-24,

2 Corinthians 4:5, Colossians 1:28

a. Power in our declaration

Acts 2:22-24, 32, 37, 3:14-15, 4:12-13

The Resurrection of Jesus emboldened us with power.

b. Proof of what we declare

Matthew 28:6, Matthew 12:40, Matthew 27:62-63, Psalm 16:10, Hosea 6:2

The Resurrection is the proof that we preach truth.

2. It is necessary for our salvation and security to be valid

1 Conrinthains 15:16-18, Hebrew 10:10-13

a. Victory over death

1 Conrinthains 15:21-22, 1 Corinthians 15:55-57,

1 Thessalonians 4:16-17

The pivotal person in the whole redemption narrative is Jesus. He is the Gospel. Without His resurrection, the redemptive work would not have been complete.

3. It is necessary for our present and future hope to be viable

1 Conrinthains 15:19-20, 1 Peter 1:3-5

Without the resurrection we would be placing our faith in a martyr, but because of the resurrection we have our hope in a living Saviour!

a. Saving hope

Titus 3:7, Ecclesiastes 9:4

We have a saving hope because Jesus is alive!

b. Sure hope

Hebrews 6:18-19

c. Soon hope

1 Thessalonians 4:13-14

A promise of His return. We must look to it as our comfort. WE don't sorrow as those without hope! We have hope because of the Resurrection.
