

Let us give thanks for all the faithful departed who have been bearers of the Word made flesh. Give us grace to follow your holy ones in lives of faith and commitment, that we may we join with the hosts of heaven in singing the praises of this holy night.

All these things grant us, O God, for the sake of the One who died and rose again, and now lives and reigns in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen
