SERMON: CAROLS SERVICE

Luke 2:1-21

THE BIRTH OF JESUS

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that the whole empire should be registered. 2 This first registration took place while Quirinius was governing Syria. 3 So everyone went to be registered, each to his own town.

4 Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family line of David, 5 to be registered along with Mary, who was engaged to him and was pregnant. 6 While they were there, the time came for her to give birth. 7 Then she gave birth to her firstborn son, and she wrapped him tightly in cloth and laid him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

THE SHEPHERDS AND THE ANGELS

8 In the same region, shepherds were staying out in the fields and keeping watch at night over their flock. 9 Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. 10 But the angel said to them, "Don't be afraid, for look, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people: 11 Today in the city of David a Savior was born for you, who is the Messiah, the Lord. 12 This will be the sign for you: You will find a baby wrapped tightly in cloth and lying in a manger."

- 13 Suddenly there was a multitude of the heavenly host with the angel, praising God and saying:
- 14 Glory to God in the highest heaven,

and peace on earth to people he favors!

15 When the angels had left them and returned to heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go straight to Bethlehem and see what has happened, which the Lord has made known to us."

16 They hurried off and found both Mary and Joseph, and the baby who was lying in the manger. 17 After seeing them, they reported the message they were told about this child, 18 and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. 19 But Mary was treasuring up all these things in her heart and meditating on them. 20 The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had seen and heard, which were just as they had been told.

THE CIRCUMCISION AND PRESENTATION OF JESUS

21 When the eight days were completed for his circumcision, he was named Jesus — the name given by the angel before he was conceived. -- Luke 2:1-21 (CSB)

- Please pray for the church in our nation, that we will continue to be a strong beacon even of governments pass laws that would seek to hamper us.
- Pray for our governments as they continue to lead us through this time of pandemic and the economic fallout from it as well as dealing with foreign powers seeking to impose their will on us.

Please continue to pray for our family in Christ in China. A communist textbook used in Chinese schools falsifies the biblical account of John 8:3–11. The textbook claims that Jesus murdered the woman found in adultery and said He, too, is a sinner. The textbook, published by the government states: "The crowd wanted to stone the woman to death, but Jesus said, 'Let the one who has never sinned throw the first stone.' Hearing this, they slipped away one by one. When the crowd disappeared, Jesus stoned the sinner to death, saying, 'I too am a sinner. But if the law could only be executed by men without blemish, the law would be dead.'" Christians in mainland China are distressed about the distortion of the biblical account. "I want everyone to know that the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) has always tried to distort the history and slander the Church," a parishioner was quoted as saying on social media.

Another Chinese Christian, identified as Paul, was quoted as saying, "The same pattern is repeated every year but the Church has never fought back or received the apology it deserves." Bitter Winter, a magazine that reports on religious liberty in China, noted the subtle objective behind manipulating the text-book. "The story teaches that the law and the Chinese Communist Party are good and pure, and transcend the impure human beings who happen to represent them. Even if the officers are corrupted, their decision should be accepted, because, honest or corrupted, they represent the Party, and the Party's law should never be questioned," the magazine writes. The magazine reported earlier that children were also being taught to oppose religion, encouraged to question the beliefs of family members and report those closest to them to authorities.

China has been cracking down on underground churches and Christian activists for years. In 2015, more than 1,000 crosses were removed from church roofs and entire church buildings were destroyed across the Zhejiang province. The Chinese government continued its campaign against Christianity during the country's coronavirus outbreak by destroying crosses and demolishing a church while people were on lockdown. More than 60 million Christians live in China, at least half of whom worship in unregistered or so-called illegal underground churches. China is ranked as one of the worst countries in the world when it comes to the persecution of Christians, according to Open Doors USA's World Watch List.
