Season of Creation – Caring for the Ocean!

"Let the waters teem with an abundance of living creatures!" Genesis 1:20

This Season of Creation (Sept. 1 - Oct. 4), we are inviting you to join us in diving into God's majestic ocean. By the coast, we often take sabbath time, feel at peace, make family memories, and experience wonder. Many of us feel the healing and restorative power of God through the sand beneath our feet, the splash of saltwater waves, and the ocean breeze.

Many of us don't realize it, but over the years, as the climate crisis has become increasingly severe, the ocean has been a saving grace, "taking the heat" of the majority of our greenhouse gas emissions. Since 1970, the ocean has absorbed more than 90 percent excess heat in the climate system.

By absorbing so much carbon dioxide and heat, God's ocean is warmer, more acidic, higher, and less predictable. God's ocean can continue to sustain us only with our mindful care.

The good news is, through our God-given intellect, both science and common sense can point us toward restorative actions to stabilize the climate and biodiversity of our common home by taking ocean-climate action. By establishing underwater sanctuaries, planting natural carbon-sinks such

as seagrass meadows and mangroves, stopping coastal drilling, curbing plastic pollution, and fishing responsibly, we can restore balance to God's majestic creation.

God's ocean is extraordinarily resilient. In fact, scientists published a report in the journal *Nature* in 2019 demonstrating that with decisive actions today, the ocean could significantly heal by 2050.
