elcome to the Cathedral Church of the Anglican Diocese of British Columbia. Here we respectfully acknowledge that we gather to worship on the traditional lands of the Esquimalt and Songhees Nations. The Friends of Bowker Creek Society bowkercreek.org

The Bowker Creek watershed headwaters are at UVic, with a tributary in Cedar Hill Park golf course. Bowker Creek meanders through Saanich, Victoria, and Oak Bay, flowing roughly parallel to Shelbourne street, around Hillside Mall towards the Royal Jubilee Hospital, past Oak Bay High School and empties into Oak Bay near the Glenlyon-Norfolk school. It is literally beneath our feet throughout much of the land where we live and work.

This local organization supports the restoration and enhancement of Bowker Creek and its water-shed to a healthy state, guided by the vision and goals of the Bowker Creek Blueprint.

They are working towards realizing a vision where the varied human uses and natural areas in the Bowker watershed are managed to minimize runoff and pollution, making Bowker Creek a healthy stream that supports habitat for native vegetation and wildlife, and provides a community greenway to connect neighbourhoods. They have a number of initiatives that you can support and join.

Peninsula Streams Society https://peninsulastreams.ca

The Peninsula Streams Society helps coordinate stream restoration and habitat conservation on the Saanich Peninsula. They also provide associated groups with the technical expertise and resources to help achieve their goals. Their goal is to achieve healthy aquatic habitat that supports self-sustaining populations of native species in freshwater and marine environments. They pursue this objective through research, restoration, innovative projects, public education and private land stewardship.
