Lighting the Advent Wreath

Carol: ★ VU 64 – O Little Town of Bethlehem (vs. 1,3,4)

- ① O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie! Above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by; yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting light; the hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.
- ③ How silently, how silently the wondrous gift is given! So God imparts to human hearts the blessed gift of heaven. No ear may hear his coming; but in this world of sin, where meek souls will receive him, still the dear Christ enters in.
- ④ O holy child of Bethlehem, descend to us, we pray; cast out our sin, and enter in; be born in us today. We hear the Christmas angels the great glad tidings tell; O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Emmanuel.

## A Service of Lessons and Carols

THE FIRST LESSON - Genesis 1:26-2:4

Carol: ★ VU 1 – O Come, O Come, Emmanuel (vs. 1,5,7)

① O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel that mourns in lowly exile here until the Son of God appear.

(Refrain) Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

- ⑤ O come, O Key of David, come, and open wide our heavenly home; make safe the way that leads on high, and close the path to misery. (R)
- ⑦ O come, Desire of nations, bind all peoples in one heart and mind; O bid our sad divisions cease, and be for us the Prince of Peace. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

#### THE SECOND LESSON - Isaiah 9:2, 6-7

Carol: ★ VU 62 – Once in Royal David's City (vs. 1,2,4)

- ① Once in royal David's city stood a lowly cattleshed, where a mother laid her baby in a manger for his bed. Mary was that mother mild, Jesus Christ her little child.
- ② He came down to earth from heaven who, with God, is over all, and his shelter was a stable, and his cradle was a stall.

  There among the poor and lowly lived on earth our Saviour holy.
- 4 And our eyes at last shall see him, through his own redeeming love; for that child who seemed so helpless is our Lord in heaven above; and he leads his children on to the place where he is gone.

#### THE THIRD LESSON - Luke 1:26-35

Carol: \* VU 48 – Hark! the Herald Angels Sing

- ① Hark! the herald angels sing, "Glory to the newborn King, peace on earth, and mercy mild, God and sinners reconciled!" Joyful, all ye nations, rise, join the triumph of the skies; with the angelic host proclaim, "Christ is born in Bethlehem!" Hark! the herald angels sing, "Glory to the newborn King!"
- ② Christ, by highest heaven adored, Christ, the everlasting Lord, late in time behold him come, offspring of a virgin's womb. Veiled in flesh the Godhead see; hail, the incarnate deity, pleased with us in flesh to dwell, Jesus, our Emmanuel! Hark! the herald angels sing, "Glory to the newborn King!"
- ③ Hail, the heavenborn Prince of Peace! Hail, the Sun of Righteousness! Light and life to all he brings, risen with healing in his wings. Mild he lays his glory by, born that we no more may die, born to raise us from the earth, born to give us second birth. Hark! the herald angels sing, "Glory to the newborn King!"

#### THE FOURTH LESSON - Luke 2:1–20

Carol: \* VU 50 – He Is Born (vs. 1,4)

(Chorus) He is born, little Child divine; play on the reeds while the lutes are strumming. He is born, little Child divine; join the song to announce the day.

- ① Through long ages of the past, prophets have fortold his coming; through long ages of the past, now the time has come at last! (C)

# Blast from the Past N 8

## Spicy Molasses Apple Cookies – Trixie Martyn

½ cup raisins
½ tsp salt
1 cup of shortening or margarine
1 ½ cups firmly packed brown sugar
¼ tsp cinnamon
¼ tsp cloves
3 eggs
½ tsp nutmeg
½ tsp nutmeg
½ tsp all spice
1 cup finely chopped apples
1 cup walnut pieces

Rinse raisin in hot water; drain on absorbent paper.

Cream shortening with brown sugar until light and fluffy. Add molasses. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition.

Mix and sift flour, salt, baking soda, and spices; add to mixture. Mix lightly. Stir in walnuts, apples, and raisins. Mix well. Drop by spoonful on greased baking sheet. Bake at 350 F for 12 to 15 minutes. Makes 5 ½ to 6 dozen cookies.
