



HALLOWEEN

Halloween is just around the corner! Normally this means walking door to door with costumes on. This year may look a little different. At the time of publication, many towns/areas in Central Indiana have not confirmed times for trick-or-treating.

The CDC has recommended a variety of precautions you can take to keep you and your family safe. This includes choosing lower risk activities such as carving/decorating pumpkins, decorating

your house, a virtual Halloween costume contest, watching Halloween movies with those you live with, doing a Halloween scavenger hunt with your family, and having your littles hunt for candy much like they would hunt for Easter eggs.

If you choose to still go out and about in your neighborhoods, remember that adult supervision is recommended, dress in bright colors and bring or wear lights, stay home if you feel sick, do not pass out candy if you feel sick, wear a mask (some recommend a face covering with a costume mask), and use hand sanitizer often.
