Greetings from Poland!

I thought I could start this news letter with a Facebook comment from an experienced pastor leading the Gospel Coalition in Poland and a small Evangelical church in Torun:

"I have lived in (the city of) Toruń for 40 years, since then I have been associated with my local congregation, which is celebrating its 40th anniversary this year (Oct 2019). During this period many people wanted to join the congregation. One student confessed that he believed Jesus, understood the forgiveness of sins, the need for baptism of faith as well as the need to belong to a community of believers; it was evident that he had joy because of this, but when it came time to get baptized ... he backed up, reasoning: "if my parents hear about my baptism may stop sponsoring my studies."

An older couple, like that student, had the same testimony. The reason for their resignation from baptism and participation in the life of the church was the awareness of a possible loss of a burial place, they said: "We bought a burial place in a Catholic cemetery and if we joined the Evangelical community we do not know whether we could be buried in this cemetery." Uncertainty of the future, fear of consequences can be an obstacle for professing Christ.

In John 12: 42-43 we read: "Nevertheless, many even of the authorities believed in him, but for fear of the Pharisees they did not confess it, so that they would not be put out of the synagogue; for they loved the glory that comes from man more than the glory that comes from God."

The possibility of losing privileges due to sitting on councils (including church councils), companies, parliaments, such as: respect, power, prestige, wealth, better income and much more - all this can be a "brake" to not get "on Jesus' side". What's more, in persuading others to stay where we were (in the Catholic church) we can use spiritual vocabulary like "God's will" and "God's calling", while in God's eyes the real reason is "love of human glory". ...

We live in a time when we less and less expect believers to give up secular ambitions, their egoism, love the world; and more and more often we don't see a problem in becoming similar to this world in behavior, music; we accept the style and priorities of life suggested to us by the world. ... "

This is a quite sobbing reflection of a pastor, looking back at 40 years of hard work in Poland. Many, many, many have not received the Gospel for the fear of men, for the fear of rejection by the Catholic

church. The Gospel does cost something, in fact, all of you. We need to continue to keep Jesus's standard high. Less than that is not the Gospel, less than that is not to be a disciples of Christ. Let's not bring down the expectations Jesus gave – "In the same way, those of you who do not give up everything you have cannot be my disciples." (Luke 14:33). As we serve here, we see each year the growing cost it takes to die to ourselves, take our cross and follow our Master in His will.
