Reasons Why We Never Need To Fear The Future

- 1. Because God's unlimited goodness is enveloping me.
 - † Psalm 23:6a, "Surely, goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life" (NKJV).
 - The Hebrew word translated as "follow" is יְרְדְּפוּנִין, Yirdefuni] and it literally means "to pursue, to chase, to hunt down, to persecute, to overtake, and to envelope." This word is typically a reference to something hostile. It is used to refer to a predator that chases, hunts, overtakes its prey, swallows it whole (envelopes it), catches it and then kills it.
 - † Romans 8:28, "We know that all that happens to us is working for our good if we love God and are fulfilling His designate purpose for our lives" (TLB/TPT).
- 2. Because God's unlimited mercy is working in and through me.
 - † Psalm 23:6a, "Surely, goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life" (NKJV).
 - What is mercy? The Hebrew word translated as "mercy" is [Ton, chesed]. This word always refers to an attitude and action that expresses undeserved kindness, undeserved grace, undeserved forgiveness and undeserved love. Underline each of the "undeserved."

What Is The Difference Between God's Goodness & God's Mercy?

- **a.** God's goodness is when God gives me what I do not deserve.
 - † <u>James 1:17a</u>, "Whatever is good and perfect is a gift coming down to us from God our Father . . ." (NLT).
- **b.** Mercy is the opposite. Mercy is when God doesn't give me what I do deserve.
 - † Romans 3:23, "Everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard" (NLT).
 - † Romans 6:23, "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life through Christ Jesus our Lord" (NLT).
- 3. God's unlimited glory is waiting for me.
 - + Psalm 23:6b, ". . . And I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever" (NKJV).
 - That means I don't have to fear death because death is not the final curtain call. Death is not a termination; it is a transfer. We're going to heaven. God saves the best for last. We're going to heaven. God saves the best for last. If you love and know Jesus, if the Lord is your Shepherd, it just gets better and better, because even if I have a tough life here on earth, I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever where there's no more sorrow, no more suffering, no more sin, no more sickness, no more sadness, no more problems, no more pain, no more pressure. With Jesus, it keeps getting better and better. The best is yet to come.

	Ţ	<u>Ephesians 4:32</u> , "Be kind to each other, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God through Christ has forgiven you" (NLT).
		• The word translated as "kind" is the New Testament Greek word [χρηστός; chrēstos]. It means "mild, pleasant; not harsh, not hard, not sharp, not bitter and not blunt; instead, one is courteous, congenial, gracious, polite, and nice."
		 The word translated as "tenderhearted" is the Greek New Testament word [εὕσπλαγχνος; eusplangchnos]. It is the combination of two Greek words "eu," which means "good" and splangchnos, which means "having strong bowels." The Greeks believed that strong emotions came from the bowels, so when you combine "eu" with "splangchnos," it refers to "strong feelings from the gut that are tender, compassionate, decent, as well as a gnawing psychosomatic pain due to empathy for someone's need."
	†	Proverbs 15:1, "A gentle answer deflects anger, but harsh words make tempers flare" (NLT).
		Do you know what being courteous and merciful are? They are another name for
	†	<u>1 John 4:18</u> , "There is no fear in love. Instead, perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment" (GNT).
		How do you know when somebody doesn't understand the grace of God? They're not to anybody else. Ungracious people are people. They don't realize how much they've been by God, so they want to hold it over everybody else.
