Be merciful as your Father in heaven is merciful. Matthew 5:48

We all have stock phrases and I find myself responding to texts regularly with "perfect." Whatever you said or did is perfect.

That's truly my response to most things especially when someone offers up a gift, or a vulnerable part of themselves, or time. It might not be what I imagined or even what I wanted, but it's perfect.

Yes, perfect may mean "flawless or ideal" but it also means "finished, complete, made whole." There is nothing in my life that is flawless so I ignore that meaning, but there is much that is made complete even in their flaws.

2020 was a little rough so I'm betting that 2021 will be perfect in many ways. It will still be rough, but as a community of faith we will continue to offer gifts, be vulnerable, and give our time. There will be relationships, experiences, and ministries that will help make us whole. We will continue to pray, love, and struggle and that will all be perfect.

I struggled when I was taught to "be perfect as your Father in heaven is perfect." The idea of glowing brilliance without flaws seemed like a ridiculous goal. But Luke's Gospel gives us the same command, translated slightly different, so we know what perfection truly is. "Be merciful as your Father in heaven in merciful."

Perfection is found in mercy and compassion. It's found when we engage with life without disguising or hiding our flaws, but offering the mercy given to us to others.

I pray for a perfect year knowing that doesn't mean smooth sailing and an escape from pandemics, politics, and natural disasters, but it is a perfection that seeks to remain merciful and compassionate through all this year throws our way.

5:30 p.m. Wednesdays in January. This is a lovely and reflective 30-minute prayer service. You can register for the Zoom link on the website.


# Sunday Worship via Zoom

As a church group, we have taken some incredible pilgrimages to some spiritual, delightful places. Here is our initial plan for our June 2022 Pilgrimage of Healing. Please carefully read through the plan and prayerfully consider if you would like to go. I'd like to hear from interested folks by January 11.

#### **PLAN**

June 6 or 7 Fly on Aer Lingus to Dublin

June 7—June 10 Zanzibar Locke in Dublin (Explore area around Dublin)

June 10 Train to Rosslare, Ireland. Ferry to either Fishguard or Pembroke, Wales. Rent vans to drive to housing (near St. David's).

June 10—June 17 Rhos y Cribed in Wales (rent entire housing). https://www.rhosycribed.com

June 17—June 20 Zanzibar Locke in Dublin

#### **COST FOR GROUP OF 28**

Zanzibar Locke 6 nights £6300/28 = \$302 per person Flights \$1100-\$1500 per person Rhos y Cribed £4168/28 = \$200 per person

Transportation (train, ferry, vans) ~\$200 per person Food for 13 days ~\$450

Total estimate for trip \$2652 (high end for flight)

#### Some things to know and expect, as this is not a vacation or tourist trip.

- 1. Preference will be given to those actively involved in church life.
- 2. There will be small group work beforehand and that will involve vulnerable sharing and accountability.
- 3. Children and youth are welcome, but they need to be able to participate in small groups and fundraisers.
- 4. There will be a good amount of walking.
- 5. I'm not a tourist guide or guardian. People need to be able to take care of themselves.
- 6. There is a lot of down time, worship, and small group time. There will also be adventures, but nobody will entertain you.
- 7. We all take turns cooking and cleaning up. I'll also need people who are comfortable driving in Wales.
- 8. There is no whining. Things will go wrong, but we always manage to have a good time.

There are only 28 spots available. I can't fudge on that number so here is a survey to figure out the most compatible group. Everyone (even youth) are expected to answer the following questions. Please return by January 11.

The word *epiphany* means manifestation or dawning light. It is the season of the church year that begins with the coming of the magi, heads to Jesus' baptism, continues with Jesus' first miracle (turning water into wine), and ends with the Transfiguration. Through these events the true nature of Jesus is revealed. **Epiphany** is a celebration of this dawning light. January 6 is the first day of Epiphany. Throughout the season, listen for themes of light in our hymns and readings.

Baptism of our Lord - The first Sunday of Epiphany (January 10) is Baptism of our Lord and a time to welcome new members through baptism or affirmation of baptism. If you are interested in being baptized or becoming a member, please contact the church office by January 3. There will be a form available on the website. We expect members to be actively engaged in the mission of the church and the small groups are a great way to connect with others, but there are no requirements.

**Virtual Epiphany House Blessing** - Epiphany is the traditional time to bless homes (like the Magi blessed Mary and Joseph's home). We will do a virtual house blessing as part of worship on Sunday, January 17. There will be a part of worship where we will invite those who want to tour us virtually around their home, so we can bless those spaces.

#### **Updated Food Pantry Operations**

As usual, our pantry is open from 9-10 a.m. Saturdays. We are now using a tool for pantries called Smartchoice. Smartchoice is software that allows folks to order food ahead of time from SOV's available stock. If you need food assistance, call the dedicated SOV food pantry telephone number 500-3588 or visit the website www.smartchoice.life/sov. If you are an elder or struggle with transportation, you may get food delivered on Wednesdays. However, if at all possible, we encourage folks to pick up food on Saturday mornings (you can also just show up on Saturdays and get groceries).

#### Columbarium & Memorial Garden

We have a great committee working on a sacred place to put ashes. The next meeting is at 6 p.m., Thursday, January 14 to review plans from the columbarium company and from Steve Landvik. There will also be a short presentation as part of the annual meeting on January 31.

# **Technology Update**

Thank you for your patience as we update and integrate the website, app, database and giving.

We will continue to send out daily prayers/devotions through the app. If you haven't downloaded it yet, go to the website and click on the button that says "download the app"

The website will continue to be the main place to access Zoom links, news, and events. All the sign up sheets can be accessed through the website and app.

We plan to begin sending weekly emails (the Peeks) through the database, once it is completely updated. We hoped to send them through the website (you may have noticed a place to register to receive them), but this isn't going to work for us. Our goal is to have an on-line directory available by the annual meeting.

If you would like to transfer your automatic giving from Simply Giving to Elvanto/tithe.ly then please do that by January 3. You do not have to switch over, but it is a little easier and the giving statements will automatically update. Of course, you are still welcome to give by check.



# Treasurer's Update

Our mortgage is down to \$32,573.74 and we will start the year with some carryover. There were years not long ago where we struggled to meet our mortgage payment and support the larger church. We have been blessed and been able to continue doing both faithfully.

This support does not happen magically. Automatic giving has helped stabilize our budget as well as intentional pledges.

We invite you to sign up for automatic giving. Either through the new platform Tithely or continue with Simply Giving. We are encouraging the Tithely model because it will help track contributions in a more automated method. Contributing through Tithely can be done either through a checking or savings account (with lower transaction fees) or by credit card (with higher transaction fees). For example, a \$50 contribution done through a bank has a fee of \$0.50. A \$100 contribution done via credit card has a fee of \$2.65. The Tithely link is on our website at: <a href="https://sovlutheran.org/give">https://sovlutheran.org/give</a>. If you are not comfortable with the automatic deduction, then please take a moment and fill out the pledge sheet that will be available before the annual meeting. We seek to live faithfully within our budget.

The proposed budget for 2021 is \$200,913. This includes over \$20,000 in benevolence (money we give away) as well as staff, building and ministry supplies. Thank you for participating in the mission lived out here.
