

Presider: Holy One,


Praises to the Holy One,

The Proclamation of the Word

First Reading: Sirach 24:1-12

The figure of Wisdom played a major role in early discussions of Christology. Wisdom is the divine word, coming from the mouth of God, and ruling over all of creation. Wisdom, created at the beginning of time, made her dwelling place in Jerusalem among God's people.



Reader: Let us hear what the Spirit is saying.

All: Thanks be to God.

Psalm 147:12-20 (NRSV; The Inclusive Psalter)

Presider: Worship the Lord, 10 Jerusalem; praise

your God, O Zion,

People: Who has strengthened the bars of your

Presider: For the Lord has established

peace on your borders and satisfies you

with the finest wheat.

People: The Lord sends out a command to the

earth, and this word runs very swiftly.

Presider: The Lord gives snow like wool and

scatters frost like ashes.

People: And hail like bread-crumbs; who can

stand against such cold?

Presider: The Lord sends forth the word and melts

them, blowing with the wind and the

waters flow.

People: The Lord declares the word

to Jacob, statues and judgements to Israel.

ALL: The Lord has not done so to any other

nation; to them these judgements

have not been revealed. Hallelujah!

All: Thanks be to God.



We own our responsibility

and pray for God's pardon.

Presider: Faithful God,

Renew us so that when we fail, we may

begin again. Amen.
