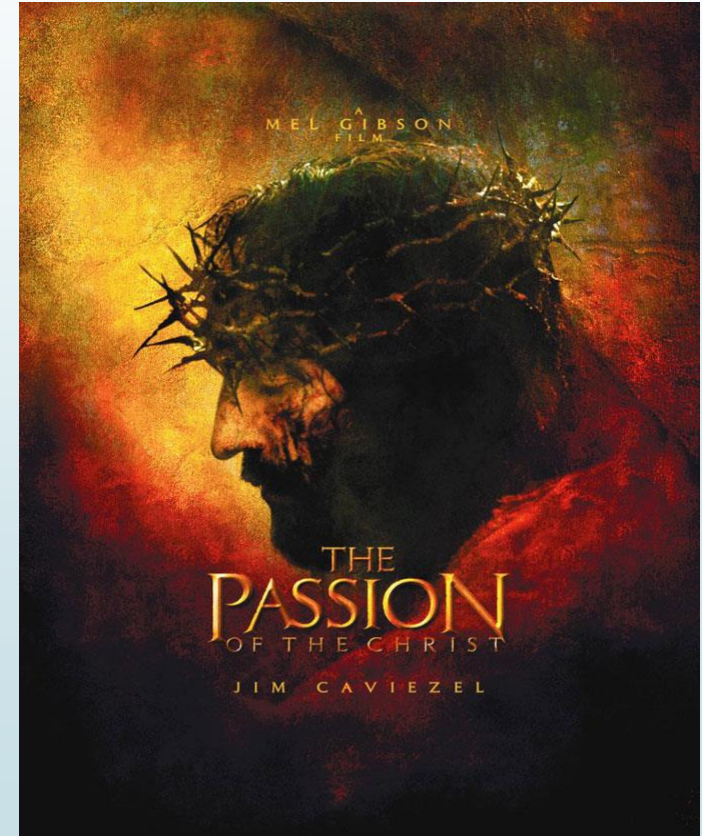

Clarifying Statement

“Redemption Of My Servant”

“Those three verses may well be the most magnificent verses in the entire Old Testament” (John MacArthur).

Three great redemptive truths are laden in these verses: Substitution, Propitiation, and Justification.



I. Vicarious Redemption (Substitution In Our Place)

- A. Borne Our Griefs – Affliction, Disease Or Sickness
- B. Carried Our Sorrows – Suffering, Pain, Or Anguish
- C. Wounded For Our Transgressions – Rebellion Or Offence

D. Crushed For Our Iniquities – Faults, Depravity,
Perverse

E. Upon Him The Chastisement – Violent Falling Upon

F. Laid On Him – Violent Falling Upon

Supported By The New Testament

“For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God” (II Corinthians 5:21)

“Who was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification” (Romans 4:25)



II. Vindicated Redemption (Satisfied Our Penalty)

A. How God Did Exact Punishment?

1. Borne Our Griefs – Lift Or Shoulder
2. Carried Our Sorrows – Labor & Burden
3. Wounded For Our Transgressions – Pierce
4. Crushed For Our Iniquities – Shatter, Break
5. His Stripes – Bruises, Lacerations



II. Vindicated Redemption

B. What Did The Son Experience?

1. Stricken By God – Fall Upon, Beat
2. Smitten By God – Slaughter, Murder
3. Afflicted By God – Put Down, Humiliate
4. The Chastisement – Punishment Or Correction

Perverse**



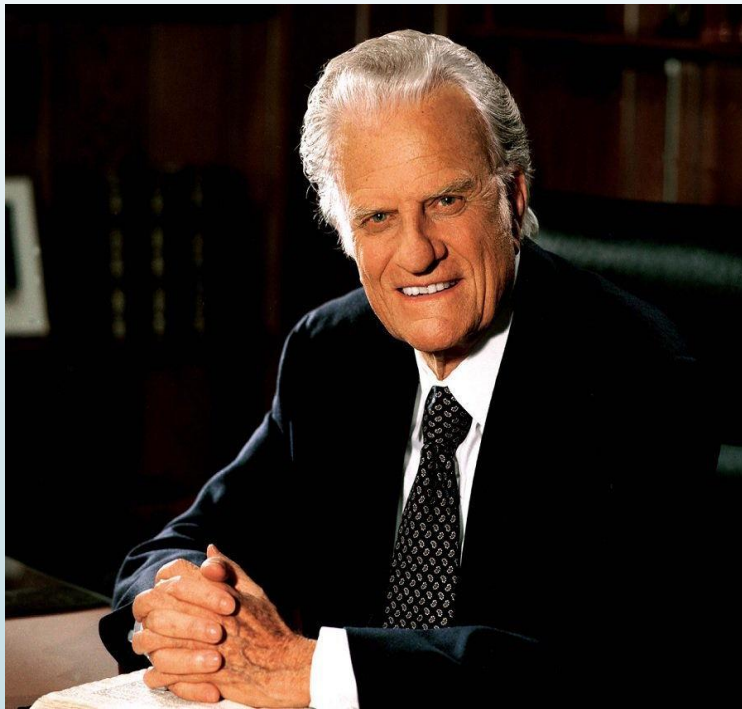

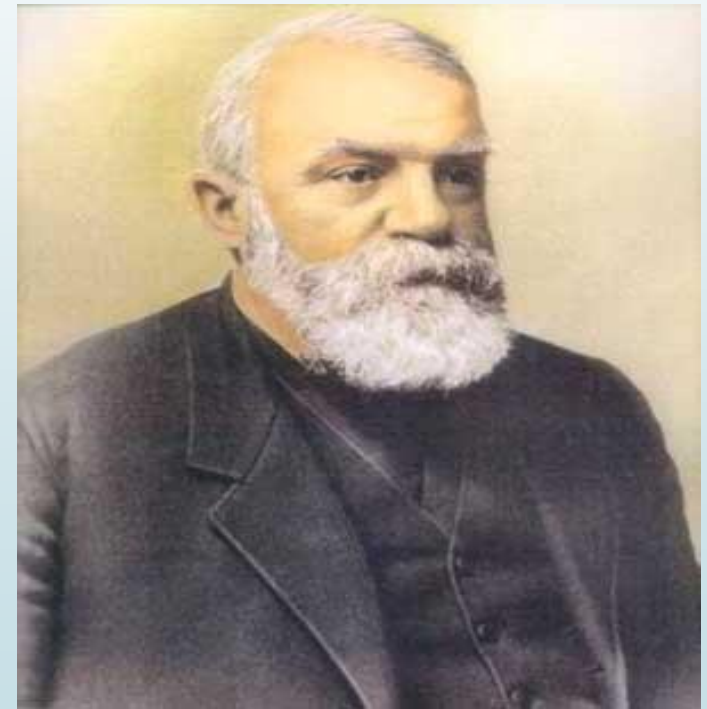
