Rev Dr. Martin Brokenleg is a retired professor and was most recently Director of Native Ministries and Professor of First Nations Theology at the Vancouver School of Theology. He holds a doctorate in psychology and is a graduate of the Anglican Divinity School. For thirty years, Dr. Brokenleg was Professor of Native American studies at Augustana University of Sioux Falls, South Dakota. He iscoauthor of the book *Reclaiming Youth at Risk: Our Hope for the Future* and codeveloper of the Circle of Courage model and provides training worldwide for individuals who work with youth at risk. He is the father of three children and an enrolled member of the Rosebud Sioux Tribe.




