ADVENT FAMILY OUTREACH

As part of our family Advent Outreach we have previously been able to provide both flocks of goats and chickens for several villages in Africa to support people and families with AIDS to have both healthy food and a way to support themselves. This year, we are fundraising during this Advent season for water and seeds for farmers in Africa. As less rain falls, a donation of \$25.00 will buy an drip irrigation system for a farmer and his family which will mean the difference between having food for the year or suffering a drought. For a donation of \$80.00, a farmer in Tanzania will receive seeds and training and then donate 20% of their crops to their village seed bank which then goes to help their fellow villagers and farmers.

This special Advent fundraising begins today and runs for this season of Advent. Please write "Advent Family Outreach" on your envelopes to ensure the funds are properly allocated.

PARISH WEEKLY INCOME UPDATE

- 2016 operating budget revenues are \$470,114 in the approved parish budget
- 72% of operating budget revenues (\$338,284) is expected from identified givers
- Based on 2016 pledges, we expect an average of \$6,505 per Sunday from identified givers
- At the end of November we had averaged \$5,925 per Sunday from identified givers.
- Last Sunday we received \$4,905.

THE LONGEST NIGHT: A BLUE CHRISTMAS SERVICE

On Wednesday, December 21st at 7:00 pm, St. Mary's Anglican Church will have a Blue Christmas Service. This special service of hope is for those who find it difficult to be merry in the season, and to provide an opportunity to acknowledge pain and sadness. In worship we will ask for God's healing to face a future sustained by hope and grace. After the service there will be a quiet space to light a candle; a chapel with a minister offering prayers for healing; "comfort items" for you to take away and the walking labyrinth will be open. REFUGEE UPDATE

As you know, we have learned that we are not able to sponsor the Zirak family as originally planned. The Outreach Committee and other interested parishioners considered some suggestions from the Diocesan Refugee Unit. We decided to apply to sponsor a Syrian family now in a refugee camp in Lebanon. The family consists of a mother and four children aged 9 to 15. The father was murdered about 5 years ago. The mother's uncle and his family, who were in the same camp, are already in North Vancouver, having been sponsored by a group of North Shore churches. Thanks to generous donations from the parish, the Refugee Fund now stands at more than \$25,000. For this family we would need at least the \$40,000 that we were planning to raise for the Ziraks. If and when the family arrives, we will need many different kinds of help, from collecting housewares and furniture to driving to appointments. In the meantime, we should continue our financial campaign. If you wish to donate, please make cheques payable to St. Philip's and write "Refugee Fund" on the envelope as well as on the memo line.
