Send your Spirit upon this bread that it may be living bread.

Send your Spirit upon this cup that it may be the cup of salvation.

That together they may be for us the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ;

Who, at supper with his disciples, took bread, gave you thanks, broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying:

"Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me."

Again he gave you thanks,
and gave it to his disciples, saying,
"Drink this all of you: this is my blood
