2020: A Good Year?

Like many of us, I was ready to leave 2020 behind. Most of us are anxiously looking forward to a much better 2021. But just when you think 2020 was a complete and total disaster, it was a record breaking year for our church solar system. In 2020, we generated more energy than ever before. Here are the statistics since we installed the panels in the summer of 2015:

To put it in perspective, the average American household uses about 10,000 KwH per year. So in our 5 years of operation, our solar panels have generated enough electricity to power 11 River Falls homes for a year. Just as importantly, 92,800 tons of carbon are not floating around in our atmosphere. So while many of us were hunkered down and just wanted the year to be over, our panels were safely and silently not just saving the church money, but also helping to save the creation as well.

One of the images we hear from scripture during the Christmas and Epiphany seasons is from John 1:5 which says—the light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it. 2020 was a dark year in many,

many ways. And yet as people of faith and action, we can also say that the light of God shone through the darkness. It shone through in your care for others, especially the most vulnerable in our community through your giving to the Compassion Fund. It shone through in the ways you reached out to shut-ins, neighbors, the struggling. It shone through in the ways you adapted and pivoted and adjusted over and over and over. It shone through in the ways you prayed for one another, worshipped and stayed connected to one another. You even showed up for outside worship when the temperature was near zero. The light of Christ was blazing bright in 2020.

Though we are all looking forward to a much better and brighter 2021, let us give thanks for the gift of faith and the light of Christ. May they continue to lead us forward into a better and righter 2021.

<u>Updating</u>

The Cities Working Group allocated the balance of the Twin Cities Recovery Fund (\$2,804) to the Lake Street Council in Minneapolis to help rebuild businesses impacted by damages from the summer upheaval. \$7,804 was received for the Recovery Fund, with \$5,000 providing food to impacted neighborhoods in both Cities in early June, in areas with little access to groceries. Lake Street Council has played a leading and vital role in rebuilding one of the city's main thoroughfares. We are most grateful to the congregation for its generosity in this effort!

Mission Partners News

Mission Education Committee has increased by \$200 each financial commitments to our six 2020 Mission Partners, has added three new Mission Partners for 2021, and will make decisions for allocation of additional 2021 mission funds in the coming weeks. New 2021 Mission Partners include the River Falls Food Pantry, Turning Point, and Servant of the Shepard for its housing program. amazonsmile Free Money for Church Ministries

The church has created an Amazon Smile account through which the church can receive a portion of the price of each purchase you make though Amazon. It is important to know that you need to do two things for the church to receive this money. First, go to Amazon Smile by typing in <u>smile.amazon.com</u> and then add First Congregational Church River Falls to your Amazon Smile. Second, every time you order you must order through your Smile account by going to <u>smile.amazon.com</u>. Once you do this, the church will receive 0.5% of each eligible order. Marriage Tune Up

This pandemic has many of us spending lots more time together which can be stressful, even when you are married. One of the tools Pastor Chris uses to help couples as they prepare for marriage

is an online assessment that helps couples see both their marriage strengths and growth areas. This same assessment can help those already married improve their marriage. As we wait for the end of the pandemic, perhaps now is the time for a 'Marriage Tune Up?' Couples will complete an online assessment and then meet privately with Pastor Chris either in person or via Zoom to go through the results. Couples will retain a copy of their confidential report. He has led hundreds of couples through this process and uses it in his own marriage. The cost is \$35 which is paid online to the company that scores the assessment.

Charitable Giving

The CARES Act, designed to help the nation recover from the pandemic, has five important implications for charitable giving.

- New Charitable Deduction for Non-Itemizers: Taxpayers who take the standard deduction can nevertheless claim a charitable deduction of up to \$300 for cash donations in 2020.
- **Higher Deduction Limits:** Individuals will be able to deduct cash gifts in 2020 to the extent of their entire adjusted gross income rather than a cap at 60%.
- **Increased Deduction Limits for Corporations:** The contribution limit for corporations has been raised to 25% for cash contributions this year.
- **Required Minimum Distributions Waived:** For the year 2020, there will be no mandatory distributions from retirement accounts, thus allowing those accounts to recover. Once they do recover, retirement funds are a tax-wise giving strategy.
- Waiver of Penalties When Retirement Funds Are Used for Coronavirus Purposes: If you are under the age of 59½, and withdraw money from your retirement plan to cover expenses incurred by you or a family member related to treatment of the coronavirus, the 10% tax penalty will not apply. In the future you may consider a retirement fund gift.

Please consult your tax advisor to see if you qualify!

Special Gifts

We are all familiar with giving to the General Fund which financially powers our ministries here at church. We are also familiar with giving to the Building Fund which pays the current mortgage for our 2012 church building addition. But did you know the church also receives special financial gifts for special projects?

A few years ago one of the 'saints' of this church named Lucille Kitzerow, left a modest gift to be used to expand and empower our music ministry. This gift continues to fund things like musical instrument purchases, choir robes, new music and Music at First Church concerts including our recent Halloween Concert.

Special gifts are also received in honor or memory of someone. Recently the Gustafson family, seeking to honor Bob Gustafson's long tradition of advocacy for teens and children, gave a memorial gift to the Youth Fund. Such a gift enables confirmation trips, mission trips and a host of other activities designed to help our young people 'flex' their faith muscles.

Lastly, special gifts can be designed for long term use through the Endowment Fund. Gifts given to the Endowment Fund are used to make sure the church has the long term financial resources to continue to do ministry in the coming generations. You can remember the church by including it in your will & estate planning. Thank you for remembering the church with your financial gifts & considering ways you may make the extra step of giving that will continue to empower the ministry of this church for years to come.
