As I write this, Christmas is only two days away. I am imagining the happy faces of the families who have benefited from your generous donations. Not only the original two families, but three more families plus the Canyon Crisis and Resource Center will be celebrating the holidays and next year in the warmth of your caring spirits. Many thanks to Mary Schenk who lives in Gates and works for AmeriTitle for forwarding the names and information about the families.

Each family received clothing, shoes, and gifts for the children and generous grocery gift cards for the parents.

The **Petersons** have lived in Gates for about 8 years and lost their log home and a rental cabin. They just got their building permit and septic approved. A rustic farmhouse is in the process of being built with the help of family.

"Being displaced is definitely not something I thought would ever happen to us. It's humbling and a giant roller coaster of feelings we have gone through. I think it has made us stronger and appreciate everything and each other more than ever. We have learned to work together as a family and the kids have sacrificed their Saturdays to join in the fun. (Maybe they wouldn't call it that)."



The **McCormicks** were renting the home that burned, and prior to moving in they had been homeless for about six months. They are staying at her mother and step-father's place in Stayton with relatives and two

other tenants that rent space. Per Onna, "We're all packed in like happy little bugs in a rug!



When their home burned, they lost everything and did not have insurance. They have every intention of moving back to Gates as soon as they're able to, but don't know if their landlord is going to rebuild or if he's going to sell. "My husband and I fully believe that God brought us to Gates for a reason. We thought it was to help needy people, but

ended up becoming the very people we wanted to help. God got us out of that situation, and now has walked us through the loss of our home. We still fully believe that He is in control and will put us where we are supposed to be. Tomorrow He may change that, and we'll be on our next adventure."

The **Fawcett** family are renting an RV after the Beachie Creek fire destroyed their home, which they stationed right next to the remains of their house in Gates. The land on and surrounding their property provides a constant reminder of the devastating damage the fires caused Labor Day night. The family's primary struggle has been trying to help their 16-year-old daughter Abby, who has an intellectual disability, feel safe. Both have had trouble coping with the pervasive anxiety that escaping the fires and being displaced has caused.



Roberta Mills lost her home on Gates Hill Rd. Per Mary Schenk, "She loved her home, it was beautiful. She always took great care of the yard, always surrounded with flowers. Roberta has a heart of gold and loves people. She goes to my church and when I speak with her she always stays positive but when I look in her eyes I see so much sadness and once in a while she gets teary eyed, it's hard to see the pain in her eyes. Unfortunately, she did not have insurance, she tried a couple times but kept getting lenders telling her it would cost a fortune due to how old the house and wood stove were in her home. She never dreamt she would ever see a fire come through Gates.

She recently had her brother out here visiting with her from Alabama and he was able to help her get her water up and running. She still has several other issues that we're dealing with. But we're happy she has a place in Gates to stay while she figures out her next step." Roberta is pictured with the gifts sent for her.

Daniel & Leslie Ward's home completely burned down with the wild fire. They lost everything including their

two work cars and tractor. Daniel is pictured with the envelope holding gift cards we sent. Leslie writes, "We were all evacuated from Gates on the morning of 9/7/20. Some of our neighbors stayed to fight the fire and help with the neighbor's home putting out fires. We stayed till 3:00 am till we could not stand the smoke anymore; it was very thick up there. We went to Church friends at 4:00 am, just got settled in and then were evacuated from there. We moved to an Aumsville church friend's home and settled in there. My husband went back up Tuesday night, 9/8/20 and the house was still there, but the neighbor's house was burned to the ground. My husband wanted to fight the fire, but Gates City ran out of water so we had no water to fight and try to save our home. My husband was putting out spot fires around our home but it was getting too hot so he had to leave. We got up early to go back up and when we arrived the home and everything we owned was gone. It was one of the hardest days of our lives to see

we arrived the home and everything we owned was gone. It was one of the hardest days of our lives to see 58 plus years gone over night. But we still have our memories. I'm very thankful to our Lord Jesus Christ that we are alive and well. God has blessed us and He will continue to bless us.

We are now staying in a cabin that our neighbors told us about. The family that has opened their cabin to us on McCully Mountain has allowed us to stay here for a few months to gather our thoughts and establish our lives again. We are very thankful to them. We have now bought a motor home to live in while we rebuild our new home on Thistledown Lane.

We are very thankful to all our neighbors and support of the community that has reached out in this time of need. We will not be defeated by the devil, God Almighty did not do this to the Canyon people, this was an act of the devil.

God allows thing to happen which we don't understand, just don't lose your faith in God because that is what the devil wants you to do. Be strong and don't give up for God never leaves us. And we will rebuild and those that don't rebuild will rebuild their lives somewhere else. May God be with us all."

It's important to note that this is NOT a toll free call, so use your cell phone or be aware of the time used. Worship begins at 10, but call in a little early to make prayer requests and give praise updates.

If you are missing out on meetings, please ask someone close to you to help. As Paul wrote in Hebrews. "Not forsaking our assembly, as some are accustomed; but comforting one another, and so much the more as you see the day approaching."
