"...To Respect Others," Ephesians 6: 1-9

To say "Tis the Season" almost always brings the follow-up phrase "to be jolly," or many other phrases that apply to the Christmas season. As we navigate this new year, what "season" are we in as a country, a church, a family, as individuals? The Apostle Paul, from a prison in Rome, tells the church at Ephesus to "walk carefully, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil." How do we apply this truth to these days of crises we find ourselves living in?

<u>TODAY'S TRUTH</u> A new president was sworn in this past week. Many are rejoicing for the "change" that is coming, and others are fearful our country's foundations are being shaken. Our response is not to trust in what men can do, but what God has called us to do.

The Bible calls us to live in a spirit of respect for others, at home and in the workplace.

GIVE - not too little, not too much

UNDERSTAND - walk in their shoes

INSTRUCT – not too much, just enough

DISCIPLINE-Confront, Correct, Comfort

ENCOURAGE – equip them to succeed and not lose heart

SUPPLICATE - pray
