The Rector's Corner

Today marks another change in the Church Year. We turn our eyes from Bethlehem and Nazareth where Jesus was born and where He lived with Mary and Joseph, to Jerusalem, the place of His Passion and Crucifixion. As difficult as it is to believe, we are heading into the Season of Lent. The Altar hanging has been changed to purple – that is one clue; but the name of this Sunday tells us the situation plainly: 'Septuagesima' – seventy days before Easter.

Today's Collect wastes no time in highlighting the reason for Jerusalem -- we are offenders who deserve to be punished:

"O Lord, we beseech Thee favourably to hear the prayers of thy people; that we who are justly punished for our offences, may be mercifully delivered by thy goodness".

It is true: we deserve punishment for all the times we fail the Lord; but mercifully He does not give us what we deserve. Mercifully, through the precious Blood of Christ, He offers us forgiveness and salvation. The Season of Lent helps us to reflect upon God's mercy, even when that mercy permits us to suffer. The Rev. L.E. H. Stephens-Hodge expands on this point:

"The word 'punished' (in the Collect) would be better translated 'afflicted'. Affliction comes to all of us, because we belong to a race which as a whole has turned away from God and gone its own way. Affliction is God's means of showing us the consequences of our wrong choices and of recalling us to repentance and a humble seeking of His Face. It is when we realise that we have all sinned and have all come short of the glory of God that we open a door whereby God is able to come in and change the situation." (The Rev. L.E.H. Stephens-Hodge in The Collects)

Today and the next two Sundays are like a warm-up. They tell us of the virtues we all need to consider. For example, in this morning's Epistle, St. Paul speaks of self-control; in the Gospel, we read of what 'right' looks like in God's eyes. Thankfully, what is 'right' to Him is not the same as what is right according to human judgement. We deserve to be punished for our offices, but by His goodness, we are mercifully delivered.
