Opening Words (as candle is lit)

Scripture – from John 1

In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God. The Word was in the beginning with God. All things came into being from the Word and without the Word not one thing came into being. What has come into being in the Word was life And the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness And the darkness has not overcome it. The Word was in the world, And the world came into being through the Word, yet the world did not know the Word. So the Word became flesh and lived among us and we have seen the glory of the Word, like the glory of a newborn child, full of grace and truth. From the fullness of the Word we have all received, grace upon grace.

(a time for reflection on the reading)

Hello, sun in my face. Hello, you who make the morning and spread it over the fields and into the faces of the tulips and the nodding morning glories, and into the windows of, even, the miserable and the crotchety –

The blessings of heaven, the blessings of earth, the blessings of sea and sky. On those we love this day and on every human family the gifts of heaven the gifts of earth, the gifts of sea and sky.

Spiritual Exercises for today:

- 1) Take a short walk and or sit outside and pay attention to one living being and its relationship to light. Perhaps the neighbor's cat who lies basking in the light. Perhaps a flower turned towards the light. Perhaps an insect hiding from the light. Or perhaps the singular silver light of a cloudy day. Give thanks for the light and the way it gives life to living beings.
- 2) Use crayons, coloured pencils, or paints to create different expressions of light morning light, afternoon light, the light of a sunny day, the light of a cloudy day, the light reflected off the ocean, the dawn light, the dusk light etc. Give thanks for the light and its beauty.
