A Note About Anne Kessler

It is with regret that I have to share with you that Anne Kessler will be leaving her position as Children, Youth, and Families Ministry Coordinator effective September 30, 2020.

This has been an extremely difficult decision for the Cathedral to make. Due to the ongoing impacts of COVID-19 on the Cathedral's operations, including the restrictions on our ability to gather in person, the Cathedral will not be maintaining this position within our staffing structure following Anne's departure. It is the Cathedral's hope, and indeed, our intention, to restructure and revive this position, as circumstances permit, and our needs require. As part of this process, the Rev. Helen Dunn and Anne will be hosting a series of virtual "Town Halls" in September prior to Anne's departure to gather feedback, particularly from children, youth, and families, as to what parishioners' hopes and dreams are for Children, Youth, and Family Ministries at the Cathedral in a COVID-19 world. Anne's ministry at the Cathedral has been extraordinary. In a mere four years she built up the Children, Youth, and Family Ministry with programs of incredible depth and integrity. She is much-loved by Cathedral families and especially by the young people

in Cathedral and Diocesan youth ministry networks. Inviting people to make Children, Youth, and Family Ministry a part of their everyday lives is Anne's specialty, and the intergenerational roster of clergy and lay volunteers Anne leaves behind is an incredible gift to the Cathedral.

As part of her work as Children, Youth, and Families Ministry Coordinator, Anne has been a member of the Cathedral's pastoral staff team. She has quickly become a trusted colleague and confidante among the Cathedral clergy and a leading voice in pastoral care.

We will miss Anne's teaching, storytelling, and preaching—anyone who's had the privilege of "sitting at the feet" of one of Anne's sermons or Godly Play stories knows what a transformational experience it is to be in Anne's presence.

Anne will be taking time for rest and reflection before beginning some preparatory courses towards teaching training in January 2021. Before that, though, we want to celebrate Anne's ministry. Effective September 15, 2020 Andrew Stephens-Rennie will conclude his ministry at Christ Church Cathedral as Director of Ministry Innovation.

During this time of COVID-19, Andrew and his family have been based in Rossland, BC. They have enjoyed the outdoors and proximity to family and have decided to make this move permanent. September 1, 2020 will mark Andrew's seventh year of service at the Cathedral.

Andrew quips that he was initially hired to "do something about young adult ministry." As we know, Andrew has contributed to this and so much more during his time. Together with the Rev. Marnie Peterson, Andrew planted St. Brigid's—an emerging, LGBTQ affirming congregation rooted in the Anglican tradition and what has grown to become the official 5:30pm Sunday evening service at the Cathedral. Andrew has also faithfully served in several management roles including Director of Communications. Of course, we will remember Andrew foremost for his leadership and vision in working with staff and volunteers to transform the Maundy Café into a five days a week, sit-down meal. The development of the Cathedral's Food Philosophy will remain a hallmark of Andrew's ministry among us.

Thanks to Andrew's thoughtful and innovative theological reflection, the Cathedral will continue to strive to be a place of hospitality that "uses food to nourish its communities in ways that cultivate connection, holistic health, and community resiliency by honouring the agency, creativity, dignity, intellect, and worth of all who come to the table." 




