Pastor's Report - 2020

Ministry in the year of COVID

Writing this report, I am tempted to say, "We made it." The End. What a year. After the tumultuous year before that included the closure of our Christian School and restructuring of our debt, I had hoped that 2020 would bring us opportunities for renewal.

We were laying plans to start a worship experience focused on the needs of those in recovery from addictions. Our first organizational meeting was held in mid-February. Then ... churches closed along with most everything else in the world.

But, we pivoted to digital ministry as quickly as possible.

- Our website was rebuilt, and a new online giving platform was put in place by our able Administrative Assistant, Melina Zagra.
- Laura Deeney, along with several amazing volunteers, invested hundreds of hours in making our first completely online Vacation Bible School!
- And, from the first, Worship was available online for those who wished to join virtually.
- The food pantry team, headed by Pat Padgett, never missed a beat, staying open and making substantial quantities of groceries available to dozens each week, a tangible reminder of God's love.
- Brian Schubert and his volunteers waited eagerly to reopen The Vault to teens down-town and finally did in the first week of September, but sadly, had to close again recently. They will be open very soon.
- I took my daily devotional "CoffeeBreak With The Word" from just a written blog to a daily video which has found wide acceptance in the community.

Awana, Youth ministry, and some of our Small Groups were able to restart in September, too.

Most of all, many of us re-learned an old truth- being a Christian is not the same as being 'churched.' We needed to practice our daily spiritual disciplines - prayer, Scripture intake, service, giving, prayer - to stay strong. I am grateful that while church attendance has been meager, the sense of connectedness has not wavered. I pray that our collective witness will fulfil our mission -

To Make a Measurable Difference for the Kingdom of God.

2021 will be a year of new challenge as the church seeks a new pastor, as I will retire from my position as your pastor on or about 12/31. I am not leaving ministry and hope to be able to continue to serve the Lord at FDC.

Please make prayer for wisdom and clarity in the work of the Search Committee and the Leadership Team a daily part of your petition, that the Lord will bring the right person, full of the Spirit, to provide pastoral care for us for years to come.

Thank you for allowing me to love and lead, to teach and counsel, to serve you as an under-shepherd of Jesus, that Great Shepherd of the flock of God. I ask your prayers for my steady effectiveness, that I would have ears to hear what the Spirit is saying to the church.
