TODAY'S READINGS

The First Lesson: Genesis 12:1-4a The call of Abram is significant in Israel's history for it describes his obedience to God, which would later reveal the establishment of Israel as a nation. This passage describes how it was God's desire to have a covenant with the nation that God loved.

Epistle: Romans 4:1-5, 13-17 The Apostle Paul quotes from the passage from Genesis stating that Abram's faith in God was the key to being in relationship with God.

The Gospel: St. John 3:1-17 The account of Nicodemus (a Pharisee) coming to Jesus shows the tension those under the strict laws had while being shown a different way. In Jesus, faithfulness to this love opened the way to a true and right relationship with God.
