I cannot experience the benefits of *sanctification* until I experience the reality of *justification*.

- Justification is <u>being saved from the penalty of sin</u> (eternal death) by God's grace (gift) through faith in Christ's substitutionary payment for my sin.
- Sanctification is <u>being saved from the power of sin</u> (enslavement to my sinful nature) by means of living in the Spirit.

Illustration: Justification is the first story. We get to the second story by first experiencing the entrance into the house and going up to the second story. This is two phases of being saved.

Illustration: Justification is called the new birth by Jesus. Every human is born by no self-effort. But the moment s/he leaves mom's body s/he begins to work diligently and continues to work until the end of this life.

This study (True Spirituality) enters through the front door and goes immediately upstairs to the second floor to explore the nature and benefits of sanctification.
