
### From Pastor Carole

Silent night, holy night. Christmas is so much like the eye of a hurricane. Peace and calm in the center but swirling all around it category 5 winds blow the dickens out of everything we know. Scripture reminds us of the death of infants ordered by Herod. How do we balance the peace and the call to stand against the forces of evil, death, and destruction? This is the life of the spirit to which we are dedicated to in our baptism. A key to finding this balance is witnessed in our promises made at our baptism and repeated in Affirmation of Baptism or Confirmation as most of us remember the rite. The liturgy asks: You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

- Buy some groceries for the food pantrycheck
- Participate in the daily Bible reading-check.
   Comment on the reading—double check.
- Attend weekly virtual services/or in person when we can— maybe once a month-one quarter check.
- Study and support our church's advocacy against racism, extremism, and terrorism of all kinds-ooo that sounds controversial, I don't feel comfortable with that.
- Attending faith development and Bible study---well, I already did that. Can I check that off? (probably not) We never stop growing in our faith in God. Intentional reflection, study and worship makes a big difference.
- Pray before meals-check.

 Support Lord of Life through regular offerings, attending meetings, serving on committees—well, maybe? But what about covid?

It's been hard and it is going to remain hard for some time to come. If you need help with your electronic devices give the church a call. # **Highlights from the December Church Council Meetings**

- A new church directory will be compiled. Families will be sent a form to complete providing names, addresses and phone numbers via email in January.
- The success of Project Spirit with its advent wreathes, presentations on St.
   Nicholas with chocolate and candy canes and Santa Lucia with gnomes was very successful.
- The date and time for the Annual Meeting was established as January 31st at 11:00 A.M. via a hybrid connection of Zoom and in church meetings. Reservations must be made by calling the church office and declaring preference of in person or virtual.
- The Council has devised a format for anonymous voting for Council candidates and the constitutional changes
- The 2021 budget draft was discussed. Pastor Carole kindly proposed not increasing her salary and housing allowance for next year. The only Pastoral budgetary difference will be in Pastor Carole's mileage allowance.
- The first half of December offerings was \$12,000.00. However, 2020 may end with an approximate eight thousand dollar deficit.

- Council moved that Pastor Carole contact the Synod and Jim Eckwall to arrange a donation of the harpsichord, which is in disrepair and difficult to tune.
